# Important information about school aged vaccinations

A number of free immunisations available on the NHS are provided in schools rather than through GP practices. These help protect against serious diseases including **cancer** and **meningitis**. We are therefore writing to parents of home schooled children to explain how they can access these important immunisations for their children.

The following children are affected:

- Girls (not boys) aged 12 to 13 years who would be in school year 8 if not home-schooled - they are eligible for HPV immunisation which helps prevent cervical cancer
- All 14 year old boys & girls who would be in school year 9 if not homeschooled are eligible for Men ACWY and Td/IPV immunisations which help protect against meningitis, tetanus, diphtheria and polio.

HPV (human papillomavirus) vaccine - protects against the two types of human papillomavirus that cause most cases cervical cancer, which is the most common cancer in women under 35 in the UK. Td/IPV vaccine (also known as the 3-in-1 or teenage booster) - is given to boost protection against 3 separate diseases: tetanus, diphtheria and polio.
