

Where are the main areas of population change in Warwickshire?

The map below shows how the population of Warwickshire has changed over the last ten years, by comparing the results of the 2001 and 2011 Censuses. The data is presented using Middle Super Output Areas (MSOA), of which there are 66 in the county. Areas of darker red indicate the largest population increases in the population, whilst areas of blue show a population decrease.

At a Borough / District level, Rugby Borough has seen the largest increase in population, rising by 14.4% since the 2001 Census. The population of North Warwickshire has remained relatively static (+0.3%), whilst the remaining three local authority areas have increased by between five and eight percent. The population of Warwickshire as a whole has increased by 7.8%. At an MSOA level, Stratford Alveston MSOA has increased by 44.0% in the last ten years, whilst the Admirals, Lawford & King's Newnham and New Bilton MSOAs have increased by 41.8% and 36.1% respectively. There are 15 MSOAs that have witnessed a population decrease, with Whitestone MSOA decreasing the greatest (-8.2%).
