




Population





Household Growth

Mosaic Profile of the Borough










Education & Skills

Percentage of residents (aged 16 and over), by Locality area, with no qualifications













Educational Attainment

JSA claimants in the past twelve months






Unemployment

- Rate of youth unemployment fallen from 3.8% to 1.7% between August 2013 and August 2014.




Potential Impact of Welfare Reform

Jobs per person aged 16-64






Workday population change

- This trend has emerged in the last 10 years.




Workday population change


