

Poverty in England 2012: The Experian Model

Credit ratings company Experian has ranked 326 local authorities in England by key poverty indicators, from child poverty to the risk of long-term unemployment. This graphic provides an overview of the figures for the five districts and boroughs in Warwickshire, placing them within a national context.

The patterns on display here are typical of many other economic and social indicators. Nuneaton & Bedworth, as a whole, performs least well in Warwickshire across all eight measures, while Stratford-on-Avon is amongst the best performing areas in the country. These district-based generalisations mask much more complicated and diverse issues at the more local level, but nevertheless provide a useful indication of positions in a national context. One specific observation is that the three northernmost boroughs in the county are considered to contain households that are at greater risk of falling into poverty over the medium and long term than are currently in poverty, relative to national trends.
