He acted as the charity's Communications Lead, taking responsibility for press releases. Despite not having had any previous hands-on experience in IT, Willy stepped up to the challenge of developing a new website and expanded the charity's social media presence. "It's been great to be able to develop new skills in my retirement and put them towards a really worthwhile cause", said Willy, who was elected as Chair of the Board of Trustees in 2016.

"Being a Trustee of the charity carries with it some serious responsibility and accountability but we have a great bunch of people to share this with and so we also have fun which after all is what voluntary work should be about.
