

Election Process

Children looked after & young people aged 11- 20 will be sent information on the CiCC Election in the post

This letter will have in it:

- A leaflet explaining about the CiCC & the CiCC Election
- How you can "Nominate" yourself to stand as a candidate for the CiCC Election
- A return envelope for the "Nomination Form"

If you return the "Nomination Form", you will then be asked to write a "Manifesto". This means you have to explain why you want to become a member of the CiCC

Looked After Children & Young people aged 8-25 will then be sent a second letter

This second letter will have in it:

- All the Manifesto's of all the candidates wanting to become a member of the CiCC
- A "Voting Card"
- A return envelope for the voting card

The returned voting cards will counted up.

The results will then be announced

The 6 Elected CiCC members will then start their "Term in Office" and start with an "Induction" to their new role

The CiCC Election will be coordinated by the WCC Practice Leader - Participation & appropriate staff & volunteers
