## Notification of works: Clarendon Avenue

Clarendon Avenue and Tavistock Street,

Following the completion of the new cycle track and signals upgrades along the A452 Kenilworth Road in 2023, I am now writing to give advance notice of planned works at the junction of Clarendon Avenue and Beauchamp Road. These works are currently scheduled to take place between Monday 19 February 2024 and the first week in March.

These works will improve crossing facilities for pedestrians and cyclists and provide connections between the on-road section of the Kenilworth to Learnington Cycle Route and existing cycle lanes on Tavistock Street and Clarendon Avenue. Works include:

- construction of a new crossing refuge on Clarendon Avenue
- extension of cycle lane and removal of a small number of pay and display parking spaces on Clarendon Avenue
- construction of a pavement buildout with cycle parking stands on Beauchamp Road

Temporary traffic signals will be used at this junction to allow safe working space for the contractors for the duration of these works. Works are being undertaken by the County Council's Highways Contractor – Balfour Beatty Living Places.
