2020 ANNUAL REPORT

Rail User Group Update

The offer of up to £175 towards plants and materials for each station within the CRP area (Stratford upon Avon - Shirley) has been welcomed by the Friends of the Shakespeare Line (FoSL). Station adopters within on the Shakespeare Line have been asked to forward their planting plans and requirements to FoSL who will co-ordinate the overall requirements and apply for the £175 funding per station where required.

Three local Rail User Groups, the Shakespeare Line Promotion Group, Solihull & Leamington Rail Users Association and the Cotswold Line Promotion Group, first two of which operate within part of Heart CRP's area, have successfully obtained up to £75,000 from the Department for Transport (DfT). The funding has been awarded in response to a successful bid to the DfT's "Restoring Your Railway" programme which the government launched last year together with £500m to support the process. The successful bid will enable and determine the economic impact and benefits from reopening the railway line between Stratford upon Avon and Honeybourne which was closed in 1976. If reopened, the line would enable an orbital West Midlands/South Midlands service as well as enabling direct connectivity between Stratford upon Avon, the Cotswolds, Oxford, Heathrow Airport and London Paddington. The work should be completed by late June 2021.

Samaritans Managing Suicidal Contacts Course

One of our volunteers attended this virtual training session and had the following feedback:

The course was very well managed by a skillful trainer who did a very effective job of including everyone involved. He clearly had an extensive knowledge in the field of managing suicidal contacts and delivered the material in a sensitive way... if space is available, I think that volunteers should have this training as they are quite likely to work on less busy stations at quiet times of day when nobody employed by the railway industry is around. Having suitably trained volunteers therefore extends the scope of the coverage by trained people and it may well be the case that a volunteer somewhere may be able to prevent a tragedy occurring.

Small Grants Fund - The first round of our Small Grants Fund has closed and we've been able to approve grants for three of our station adoption groups to help pay for tools, plants and CRN membership. Next application window opens on the 1st April!
