## Goals/Objectives

- Encourage rail users to sign the Go Green by Train pledge.
- Engage with them on sustainability within the rail industry.
- Educate rail users about the exact figures regarding the environmental benefits of rail travel.
- Create a Sustainability webpage, a Sustainability Statement and a place for people to write their own pledges.
- Create a video montage of the signed pledges to be shared on CRP and partners' websites and social media



# Background

The Heart of England CRP joined other community partnerships and volunteer groups across Britain to spearhead a national campaign highlighting sustainable travel as a key factor in tackling the climate crisis, in the build up to COP26.

Community Rail Week, organised by Community Rail Network and sponsored by Rail Delivery Group, is the first event of its kind in the UK and saw hundreds of local partnership projects and volunteers getting involved to promote green travel by train during 18th - 24th October.

With greener transport now recognised as a fundamental part of the solution to climate change, Community Rail Week, with the tagline 'Go Green by Train', looked to drive change at a community level through the efforts of 74 community rail partnerships and over 1,000 station friends' groups across Britain. The Heart of England CRP hosted two events during the week, our Pledge Day and a Sustainable Stations Workshop.



## Approach

- Prior to the pledge day itself, we sent out an invitation to stakeholders, local dignitaries, community groups and project partners to invite them to attend the Pledge Day. We also attached a digital version of the pledge card so, should they not be able to attend, they were still able to sign the pledge, take a photo and be a part of the pledge day photo montage.
- On the day, we had a table on the concourse at Coventry Station, with more information as to the benefits of travelling by rail. We asked rail users to sign the 'I'm Going Green by Train' pledge on a white board (reusable) and then took a photo of them holding the pledge.
- We were joined by representatives from our funding partners as well as by the Young Rail Professionals and CRN, who supported us throughout the event.

- The images were be made into a Pledge Card video, now on our website <a href="https://homepage">homepage</a> and on our social media sites.
- Everyone who wrote a pledge, received a Bird and Butterfly seed packet with the CRP logo on them. The first 125 people also received a cookie from Wicked Cookies. We had additional gifts such as coffee pouches and mouse mats to give out.
- We interviewed some of the key community figures, the Lord Mayor of Coventry, the Mayor of Nuneaton and Bedworth, the Deputy Mayor of Warwick, the Executive Director of WMR, and the video is now available to watch <a href="https://example.com/here.">here.</a>
- To ensure we continue to engage with people regarding sustainability, we have a new Sustainability page on our website where we highlight the CRP's Sustainability Statement, the sustainable practices our partners are adopting, and where people can make their own sustainable pledge.
- Thanks to our partners at Warwick District Council, as part of their Better Points scheme, participants were able to can earn extra rewards for hopping on the train in Warwick district throughout Community Rail Week.
