Overview



Aims

As part of the Avanti West Coast funded project Careers, Creativity and the Commonwealth, the Heart of England CRP wanted to provide an inspirational and eyecatching mural for people travelling to Commonwealth Games events by train and arriving at Birmingham International. In addition, we aimed to improve the station environment, support local artists, showcase contemporary street art and have a piece of art that represents how the railways connect our communities.


Inspiration

Using the current Avanti locomotive graphics as a starting point for inspiration, the mural concept embodies a subtle sense of movement. Future transport and infrastructure developments are implied by angular shapes and forms, the spectrum of colours reference the varied national flags of the Commonwealth countries,



whilst the use of blue is a contextual hint to the Coventry City of Culture 2021. The low wall mural uses the Avanti West Coast Brand palette and, viewed from above is like a railway network, with movement. We envisage seeing it at speed as you arrive and in reverse when departing. At the start of the low wall mural is a nine square chequered flag motif to hint at the City of Culture and a nod to the two tone music movement that started in Coventry.

Installation

On the 26th April, Lord Numb from Brink Contemporary Arts began work on the mural mapping out the abstract shapes on the higher wall, before adding the colour and detail. Over several days, and in between rain showers, the mural began to come to life with rail users and staff coming to see the progress. Network Rail kindly supplied the safety barriers for the



duration of the work, to ensure that the artists were working in a safe place and to ensure that there was no risk of passengers coming into contact with wet paint. Towards the end of the week, the low wall 'rail network' was completed with the chequered flag bringing the final connection between Birmingham and Coventry.

Legacy

The Heart of England CRP will be using the mural at Birmingham International to engage with schools based on the Coventry - Birmingham Line. Along with Lord Numb, they will be developing lesson plans that encourage students to see stations as destinations in themselves and they will give them the opportunity to visit the mural, before creating their own designs based on the theme of connections. The importance of staying safe on the railways and how to be a good rail citizen will be introduced and discussed with the students before going on the train.
