

his circular route incorporates the National Trust's **Packwood House**, three pubs and a flight of locks as well as taking you through some of the prettiest countryside between Warwick and Solihull.

If you're heading into Lapworth village, do take a look at the stained glass windows, sculptures and carvings at the Grade I listed Church of **St. Mary the Virgin**, which traces a history back to Norman times.

Packwood House is a magnificent Tudor mansion with a wealth of tapestries and fine furniture, famous for its topiary garden There's also a National Trust shop and café in the New Build.

If you want to stock up in advance of your walk there's the **Village Stores** in Kingswood, just six minutes from the station. Towards the end of the trail the **Canal Shop** makes a handy stopping off point. Or simply enjoy the picnic area on the **Kingswood Arm** of the canal. Otherwise the trail will take you past no less than three top notch pubs!

Lapworth is on the main line running between Birmingham & London. There's a two-hourly service in both directions running between Leamington Spa and Birmingham Moor Street. In peak hours additional trains run to and from Leamington. Trains also run at peak times direct to Stratford-upon-Avon.

There are limited facilities available at this station.

A. The Punch Bowl

It may be right at the start, but this country gastro pub with 11 bedrooms, restaurant, bar, garden and terrace is worth a stop regardless! Just don't overdo things on the extensive menu and wine list!

B. Packwood House

First built around 1570, this much-restored Tudor house, park and garden is noted for its topiary. Explore the house, the fabulous gardens or simply make a pitstop at the Cafe where you can enjoy cakes and bakes, pasties and sausage rolls!

C. Kingswood Arm

The Kingswood Arm is a short section linking the Stratford Canal with the Grand Union Canal, which stretches for 137 miles (220 km) with 166 locks. Take a well earned rest at the Lapworth Link Picnic Area and watch the boats serenely glide past.

E. Baddesley Clinton

A secluded, intimate estate built in 1500 in the heart of the Forest of Arden. Stroll through the walled garden, seek out the hiding spot for priests and admire the oh-so-gorgeous views across the moat.

F. The Boot

Stop off at this country pub and restaurant for the wide-ranging food menu that features prime steaks, classic salads and succulent seafood. You'll linger for the traditional atmosphere (and the teepee!)

2. Turn R up the lane to the Punchbowl pub after 500 m. Cross with care and continue forward along Chessets Wood Road for 450 m.

- 3. At National Trust sign, turn L onto Packwood Avenue. This can be very muddy in winter. Continue for 1 km to reach Packwood House, where there is a café.
- 4. Turn L onto the lane for 550 m to road junction. Go forwards for 500 m. Go L onto public footpath along private drive to reach the canal after 300 m.
- 5. Turn L and go down the flight of locks. After 500 m there is a canal shop (closed Fridays) and access to The Boot pub. Continue down the flight to reach the canal. Cross the bridge signed "Grand Union" and along towpath for 200 m.
- 6. Turn L across the bridge with a sign to the Navigation pub. After 300m, emerge onto Old Warwick Road (CARE: blind bend). Turn R for the pub.
- 7. Turn L along the road for 200 m, then R onto Station Lane for 500 m to reach the Station.
