Completed Projects



A Day Like This

Throughout October, with thanks to funding from CrossCountry and Community Rail Network, the Heart of England CRP worked with Highly Sprung Performance on a project to empower and inspire newly arrived families to travel by train. Working with participants referred through the Coventry Refugee and Migrant Centre, we hosted three workshops focussing on rail safety, the previous rail experiences of the families, where they could travel to from Coventry and how to buy tickets and navigate Coventry Station.





On the 15th October, we took a trip down to Wilmcote to spend the day at Shakespeare Birthplace Trust's Mary Arden's Farm. Families enjoyed a range of activities from scavenger hunts to pottery painting and they were encouraged to take photos throughout the day to document the trip through their eyes. On the 29th October, in the community room at Coventry Station, we hosted a screening of the film of the day and this, along with a full report of this joyous project will soon be available on our website.

STEM + Challenge Days

Between March - July 2022, we worked with the Smallpeice Trust to provide 4 Railway Engineering STEM+ Challenge Days in 4 Secondary Schools across the area. Thanks to funding from CrossCountry, 230 students benefitted from the STEM day with a staggering 88% saying that they'd learnt new skills and 86% gaining an increased appreciation of what railway engineers do.



We were also able to provide funding to Nazeefah Ali from Bordersley Green Girl's School to attend the Birmingham University Rail Course. Nazeefah is now seriously considering a career in the railway engineering! Read more about her experience and the impact summary of STEM+ days here.

Upcoming Projects



Rail Week at Finham Park 2

Next week we will be at Finham Park 2, a secondary school based in Tile Hill, bringing a whole week of cross-curricular rail activities to 120 Year 8 students. With guest speakers from the rail industry, teachers from the school and the CRP all leading sessions on themes such as sustainability, rail safety and art and food on the railways, it promises to be an amazing week.

Plans for 2023 - 2024, Nuneaton - Leamington Line

We are developing plans for the next year focussing on increasing patronage and developing a line identity for the Nuneaton to Leamington Line. There are three phases to our plan, outlined below and we are planning for lots of community and school engagement around the project. More details will be shared in the near future!

Spring Term 2023

School and Community Engagement

Working with schools to develop ideas about what makes the stops along the line good places to visit. Investigate opportunities and attractions along the line and looking for common themes to tie the line together.

This will lead on to inviting entries for a new name for the line. A shortlist will be decided by a panel before a public vote with groups we've worked with and the wider communities deciding the new name for the Nuneaton - Leamington Line.

May 2023 - May 2024

Art along the line

Using the new line name as inspiration, we will create artwork at all stations on the line. An individual artist would work at each station with input from the local community and schools in the form of workshops/surveys etc with the final art works being installed Easter 2024.

Easter 2023

Coventry Station Community Day

Following this year's community day success, we will host another community day with a mix of stalls, activities and entertainment for all on the boulevard in front of the station.

The day will include the unveiling of the new Nuneaton - Leamington line name and a prize giving to the winning entry.

Friends of Leamington Station

The Friends of Leamington Station, formed in 2004, enter the Royal Horticultural Society annual Heart of England It's Your Neighbourhood scheme where the gardens are usually assessed as Outstanding.

This year we achieved a score of 97%, better than ever before, after a particularly difficult hot and dry summer.

No doubt about Outstanding yet again.

A dozen or more active gardeners work at the station every week of the year – plus smaller groups, and their dedication has certainly paid dividends this year.

Green waste has always been composted on site before distribution around the gardens and rainwater from the garden shed roof is saved for use.

The Friends are grateful to Community Rail
Partnership, Community Rail Network and Royal
Leamington Spa Town Council for financial support for
all they have achieved on the station gardens over the
last 18 years. The trust and encouragement from
Chiltern Railways has been unswerving.

The RMT have announced strike action on the 5th, 7th and 9th November. Please check you travel arrangements on and around those dates in case your trip is affected.



Partner Updates



West Midlands Rail

WMR have recently created a new Community Rail Strategy, this will provide the business with a vision to focus on for the duration of the National Rail Contract with the support of their colleagues and community partners. The Strategy has been designed on the key topics which have emerged from applications to our Customer and Communities Improvement Fund, CRPs annual activity plans and funding applications for our volunteer groups. The five strategic themes are Youth Engagement, Wellbeing, Personal Safety, Encouraging Modal Shift, Rail Recovery and will be delivered under the vision for supporting local social and economic regeneration. The themes in the strategy complement the four pillars featured in the Department for Transport's 2018 Community Rail Development Strategy.



WMRE

The West Midlands Rail Executive (WMRE) are updating the West Midlands Rail Investment Strategy and need your support.



Help WMRE plan the next 30 years of rail in the region by reading their draft strategy and completing the online survey.
