Lifelong Links is for young people in care and those with care experience under 25 years. It helps find and bring together people who care about you. This can be people you know well, people you have not seen for a while (like a former teacher or carer) and even relatives who you have not yet met.


Information for young people











How can it help me?

- Finding family and friends of your choice who you care about.
- Learning more about your family history.
- Bringing together people who you want in your life and who you can turn to for support as you get older.

How does it work?

A Lifelong Links coordinator will meet with you to get to know you and find out who matters most to you. They will try to find those people and help you connect with them. If successful they will talk with you and your social worker to decide if these people should come to a meeting called a Lifelong Links Family Network Meeting.

What is a Lifelong Links Family Network Meeting?

This meeting should offer a chance to meet and connect with those who care about you. It will identify how they can help you and agree a plan which will become part of your care or pathway plan.

How do I take part in Lifelong Links?

Do I have to take part?
