

YOUTH SERVICE DELIVERY

The Delivery Model of the Youth Service is in 3 main strands

One 2 one Youth Work Young people choose to be referred to us



School based Group Work

Youth Workers jointly working with schools and young people delivering targeted youth support to support the right young people at the right time. Delivering youth work for small groups of young people over a whole academic term allowing positive relationships to flourish



Youth Clubs and Street based Work

This work takes place in the evenings. Young people can self refer and take part in a variety of youth work and activities. Average of 22 evening sessions a week delivered

YOUTH CLUB DELIVERY



We run **Youth Clubs** from **Chess** (Nuneaton) **Lillington** (Learnington) and **Ratcliffe** (Atherstone)



We run smaller **Youth Hubs** from **Hatters** (Nuneaton) **Claremont** (Rugby) and **Saltway** (Stratford)

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

For all youth work recruitment during this period, we have appointed a range of trainees or apprentices due to the ongoing challenge of sourcing JNC-qualified youth workers

Nationally 20% of paid youth workers are qualified (NYA June 25)

100% of our full time staff are qualified or working towards qualification

We have strong links with Wrexham University and Roehampton University who support our training



Emotion Management is the main area young people requested for support



Schools Group Work

145 Sessions Delivered1871 contacts made with young people

15 Warwickshire Secondary schools100% of schools would ask for this service again



Youth Clubs and Street Based Work

990 Sessions delivered11310 contacts made with young people

Top 3 issues discussed - relationships, family and education

YOUTH SURVEY 2025

307 young people took part in our survey this year

Only 37% said they felt safe at school
21% said they would consider carrying a weapon
63% said they faced challenges with their mental health
45% of the 16 - 18 year olds said they were sexually active
28% of 11 - 13 year olds have tried vaping
32% have witnessed online self harm or suicide content

YOUTH WORK ASSESSMENT

All young people work with their youth worker to self assess in 6 areas on a 1-5 scale.

- Young people score themselves the lowest in Problem Solving with 71% scoring 3 or less
- Responsibility scores are the highest overall with 39% of young people scoring themselves 4 or above

FEEDBACK FROM YOUNG PEOPLE

Young People rate us **4.7** out of **5**

90% of young people felt that their youth worker supported them to make positive changes in their life
