

WCC Concessionary Travel - Expiry date summary

Older Person's Passes (OPP)

Passes will be issued for five years from the date of application, unless evidence indicates that the applicant's stay in Warwickshire has an end date.

Disabled Person's Passes (DPP)

All categories: If the person qualifies for OPP before the expiry of their DPP evidence then the pass expiry date will be one month after they become eligible.

* Where the PIP expiry date is longer than five years in the future, issue the pass for a period which allows a further renewal for at least a year to allow for a further renewal before the PIP expires (e.g. if the award lasts for 5 years + 3 months, issue pass for 4 years initially).
