Our free mobile libraries service makes 250 stops across the county over a four-week schedule, travelling out to different communities to ensure everyone can enjoy what Warwickshire Libraries has to offer. This includes:

Each mobile library is accessible with a low entrance of two small steps and a ramp at the rear for wheelchair users.
