Introduction

It is vital for schools, education and other Warwickshire support services to work together and in partnership with families to deliver the best possible outcomes for all children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) (See <u>Inclusion Charter</u>). By doing this, we can plan support for schools to meet increasingly varied and complex SEND needs.

In response to feedback from stakeholders, we are continuing to move to a theory into practice-based training model with the focus on the development of classroom strategies and practical interventions to meet SEND needs. SEND integrated services are working collaboratively to produce revised and new practice-based training for schools and settings.

To promote these new training opportunities the Delivering Better Value Programme is subsidising the top five training requests identified from feedback provided by primary and secondary SENDCos for an additional term (see individual training offers for details in both universal and bespoke sections of the brochure).
