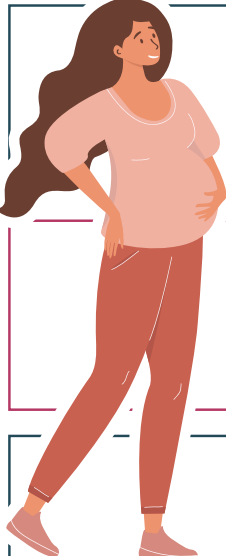


Age due	Diseases protected against
 Eight weeks old	• 6 in 1 (Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough), polio, Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib) and hepatitis B) • Meningococcal group B (MenB) • Rotavirus
Twelve weeks old	• 6 in 1 vaccine2 • Rotavirus vaccine2 • MenB vaccine
Sixteen weeks old	• 6 in 1 vaccine3 • Pneumococcal vaccine1 
One year old (on or after the child's first birthday) 	• Hib & MenC – 1st dose. MMR (1st dose) at 1 yr. Pneumococcal 2nd dose. MenB – 3rd dose.
Eligible paediatric age groups	• Influenza (each year from autumn/winter)
Three years four months old or soon after	• 4 in 1 (Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis and polio) • Measles, mumps and rubella – 2nd dose
Children aged twelve to thirteen years	• HPV vaccine for the prevention of cancers and genital warts caused by the human papillomavirus 
Fourteen years old (school Year 9) 	• 3 in 1 teenage booster (Tetanus, diphtheria and polio) • Meningococcal groups A, C, W and Y
Pregnant women	• RSV • Flu • Whooping cough
65 years old	• Pneumococcal (23 serotypes) 
65 years of age and older	• Influenza (each year from September)
Turning 65 (01/09/2024) and Aged 70 to 79 	• Shingles
75-79	• Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)
