Your Application

Applications, or preference changes, which were received after the national closing date of 31 October 2022, which were not due to a house move before 31 December 2022, have been classed as late applications and will not have been considered in this round of offers. These will instead be processed after 1 March 2023, as part of the reallocation rounds (see below). Reallocation Rounds

Reallocation rounds are used to process late applications and late preference changes and to make re-offers. We have two reallocation rounds, as follows:

First Reallocation F	Round
Deadline for new applications to be considered,	15 March 2023
including any changes to an existing application	
First reallocation round expected to be completed	3 April 2023

To be considered in the first reallocation round, we must have received your application (or have been notified of any chances to your application, including an updated address) by 11.59pm on 15 March. We expect to be notifying parents and carers of re-offers **after** 27 March.



New applications or changes to existing applications received after 15 March will be considered in the second reallocation round:

Deadline for new applications to be considered,	5 April 2023
including any changes to an existing application	
Second reallocation round expected to be completed	21 April 2023

To be considered in the second reallocation round, we must have received your application (or have been notified of any changes to your application, including an updated address) by 11.59pm on Wednesday 5 April. We expect to be notifying parents and carers of re-offers **after** 19 April.

Late applications received after 5 April will be processed as and when they are received, up to and including 31 August 2023. The in-year admissions process will then commence from 1 September 2023.

Making Changes to Your Application

The school place your child has been offered is based on the information you provided in your application. You **must** notify us of any changes, such as moving house, as soon as they happen. Please note that the relevant admission authority (e.g., local authority, academy trust or governing body) may withdraw an offer where it is established that it has been obtained through a fraudulent, or intentionally misleading, application.

If you wish to make any other changes to your application, such as adding further school choices, then please contact us at www.warwickshire.gov.uk/contactusadmissions in time for the two reallocation deadlines listed above. If you are not a Warwickshire resident, you should contact your own local authority instead.

Changes can be made to an application any time until 31 August 2023.

Waiting Lists for Non-Selective Warwickshire Schools (i.e. not grammar schools)

If your child has not been offered a place at their first preference school, this is because there were more applications received for that school than there were places available. When this happens, applicants are ranked in the order of the school's over-subscription criteria, as determined by the admission authority of each school. Places are then offered to those applicants who have been allocated the highest criteria until all available places at the school are filled.

Your child is on the waiting list(s) of any non-selective school(s) listed as a higher preference on your application than the school you have been offered. The waiting lists are held in the order of over-subscription criteria, as determined by the school concerned, and will consider applications received before and after the deadline equally.



Your child's position on any of those waiting lists will change and applicants will move both up and down on the waiting lists. This is due to vacancies at the school being filled and further late applicants being added to the waiting lists, in criteria order.

Late applications can be received and processed until this coordinated admissions process ends on 31 August 2023.

Waiting lists will be held until 31 December 2023, when all lists will be discarded. It will then be at the discretion of each school whether they wish the local authority to maintain an applicant list on their behalf for the rest of the academic year, whether they want to maintain a list directly or whether there will be no applicant list.

Waiting Lists for Warwickshire Grammar Schools

Your child may not be on the waiting list(s) for any grammar school(s) that you have named on your application, as these lists are held based on score data related to the 11+ testing process. This is explained further in a document titled: "2023 entry 11+ Offer Day", available at www.warwickshire.gov.uk/admissions

This confirms the qualifying score that has been set for each of the county's grammar schools for 2023 entry, as well as the minimum score required for an applicant to be placed onto the waiting list for each one.

If your child has not scored at least the minimum waiting list score for your preferred grammar school(s), then they will not be placed onto the waiting list for that school. This is because they are not considered to have met the required academic standard and the application will not be considered any further. You can, however, still lodge an appeal for a place at any grammar school where you have been refused a place, regardless of your child's 11+ test score. More details on appeals are available below.

Waiting lists will be held until 31 December 2023, when all lists will be discarded. It will then be at the discretion of each school whether they wish the local authority to maintain a waiting list on their behalf for the rest of the academic year, whether they want to maintain a list directly or whether there will be no waiting list.

The waiting lists for the Warwickshire grammar schools will be open from Wednesday 8 March.

Waiting Lists for Schools in Other Local Authorities

If you have been refused a place at a school which is maintained by a different local authority than Warwickshire, then you will need to contact that authority directly for information on why it has not been possible to offer a place to your child, and to determine your child's position on the waiting list for the school concerned.

School Appeals for Warwickshire Schools



You have the right to appeal for any school that you have named on your application that is listed as a higher preference than the school offered and where your child has been refused a place. This includes the Warwickshire's grammar schools.

Please note that you can only appeal once for each school, for each academic year of entry.

We recommend that you think carefully about lodging an appeal. Many appeals that are heard for Warwickshire's schools are not successful and lodging an appeal, submitting relevant evidence, attending an appeal hearing and awaiting the outcome of an appeal can be a daunting and emotional process. If you wish to appeal for a Warwickshire school, please complete the online appeal form at www.warwickshire.gov.uk/schoolappeals

Some schools in Warwickshire operate their own appeals process. You will be advised if this is applicable when you attempt to lodge the appeal through the website above. In such cases, please contact the school concerned for more information about their appeal process.

You will need to set out the grounds for appeal at the time of lodging your appeal. You can also submit additional information in line with the scheduled hearing dates as set by Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services, who will organise your appeal hearing. All appeals will be acknowledged within 5 school days (term-time only).

Please submit your appeal by the deadline of **28 March 2023.** Appeals submitted after this date may be subject to additional delays. For more information, please visit: https://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/schoolappeals

If you wish to appeal for a school in another local authority, you should contact the school directly for further information about their appeal process.

School Transport

If you are interested in applying for transport assistance for your child, please first read the Home to School Transport Policy at: https://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/schooltravel.

i) Free Transport Assistance

If you wish to apply for transport assistance for your child (for example, a free bus pass), then you should do this as soon as possible and before the deadline of **31 May 2023**, to ensure that any approved transport assistance is in place by September.

There is no guarantee that applications received after 31 May will be processed in time for the start of the new academic year in September. In these circumstances, you will need to make alternative arrangements for your child to travel to and from school until we are able to make suitable arrangements.



ii) Paid School Transport (Vacant Seats Scheme)

If your child does not qualify for free transport, then you can still make an application for a paid bus pass (i.e., a bus pass that is paid for by the parent or carer). Further details about this scheme can be found at https://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/schooltravel.

Please note that there is no guarantee that your child will be allocated a seat on your preferred school bus service.

Paid transport applications can be submitted from 1 June 2023 until the deadline of **8 July 2023**. There is no guarantee that applications received after 8 July will be processed in time for the start of the new academic year in September.

In these circumstances, or if we are unable to arrange paid transport on your preferred bus service, then you will need to make alternative arrangements for your child to travel to and from school.
