

## Breakdown of 2023 Entry Secondary School Offers Non-Selective Schools in Warwickshire

### Introduction

A school might receive more applications than the number of places available (the Published Admission Number or PAN). If this happens for Community, Voluntary Controlled schools or Academies (where the school has adopted the Local Authority admissions arrangements), places will be allocated using the Local Authority's oversubscription criteria.

If a Voluntary Aided or Foundation school receives more applications than it has places available, the governing body for the school will allocate places according to that school's published admission criteria.

Only **on time** applications received have been processed for places offered on 1 March 2023. Late applications and subsequent changes to applications will be processed through the reallocation rounds, which begin on 21 March 2023.

### How school places have been allocated at Warwickshire secondary schools

All mainstream secondary schools in Warwickshire are classed as their own admission authority. This means that each school's Governing Body (represented by the Diocese, for some schools) or Academy Trust determine how applications received for their school will be considered and prioritised, where there are more applications received than there are places available. Further information about this is detailed in each school's Admission Arrangements policy which can be found on the school's individual website.

Some schools choose to adopt the following criteria suggested by Warwickshire County Council (WCC) to prioritise the applications received for their school. In all cases, children with the school named on an EHC Plan must be admitted first:

1. Looked after children and all previously looked after children, including those children who appear (to the admission authority) to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted.
2. Children living inside the priority who will have a brother or sister at the school at the time of admission.
3. Other pupils living inside the priority area.
4. Children living outside the priority area who will have a brother or sister at the school at the time of admission.
5. Other children living outside the priority area.

Within each criterion, priority is given in order of straight-line distance (miles) between the home address and the school applied for. The shortest distance has the highest priority.

If you live within Warwickshire Local Authority and we are unable to offer your child a place at any of the schools you applied for, we will allocate a place at the next nearest school that still has vacancies available once all on-time applicants for that school have been considered.

The following table shows all non-selective (not grammar) secondary schools in Warwickshire and the number of offers made for each for the 2023 entry year. Also provided is the number of places available at each school, for this year of entry, and confirmation of the last offer made.

If you have named a school outside of Warwickshire, you will need to contact the relevant Local Authority that the school is located in to discuss your application further.
