<u>General information relating to the testing process</u>

The main testing dates for Warwickshire on-time candidates were Saturday 14 & Sunday 15 September 2024, with a supplementary session held on 21 September 2024 for those who were unable to attend the original date due to illness or prior engagements. There were no generalised issues arising from the testing sessions.

The testing so far has consisted of 49% females and 51% males.

There have been no issues to report on shared testing as WCC are now part of the West Midlands Grammar School Consortium.

• Individual Case Referrals

It was agreed that no individual circumstances will be considered through the Local Review process, but families will be able to outline their specific cases through an appeal at a later stage, should this be required.

• Access Arrangement Referrals:

Percentages pertaining to SEN offers (both East and South):

- <u>120</u> children were considered for access arrangements this year. Conducted with a panel which included colleagues from IDS and the Educational Psychology Service.
- **<u>87</u>** of those who informed us of their child's special educational need and provided additional information for us to consider in this regard, were granted some form of provision.
- <u>22%</u> of those who were considered for access arrangements are likely to receive an offer for a Warwickshire grammar school.
- <u>18%</u> of those who were considered for access arrangements **AND** were granted some form of provision, are likely to receive a grammar school offer.
- As a proportion of the total tested cohort (2258 children tested by Warwickshire),
 <u>1%</u> of children granted access arrangements are likely to receive a grammar school offer.

Any Other Business

For the purposes of transparency, it was agreed that moving forward a Head Teacher will attend the virtual meeting in which Special Arrangements are considered and awarded. The Head Teachers will rotate year on year.
