Data

Recording Ever6 CWSW

Noting pupils currently on CIN and CP plans (CWSW) on your Management Information System will assist in creating a data base of CWSW.


Recording the date pupils went onto a Child in Need or Child Protection plan and the date the plans close will also provide you with your Ever 6 CWSW list (those who have had a plan in the last 6 years) enabling you to monitor this cohort of disadvantaged pupils.



Questions to consider

 Have you recorded your CWSW on your MIS? (this is in Section 10 of a pupil's record on SIMS)

Mental health and wellbeing



Social, Emotional and Mental Health Needs

Social, emotional, and mental health is one of the 4 broad areas identified in the SEND code of practice: 0 to 25 years.

Children with a social worker are more likely to experience social, emotional, and mental health issues than their peers.

For example, they may struggle with:

- forming trusting relationships
- executive functioning skills
- social skills
- managing strong feelings e.g. shame, sadness, anxiety, and anger
- sensory processing difficulties
- coping with transitions and change

Questions to consider


- Is your SENCo working with you to plan interventions?
- Which pupils will require additional support to prepare for transition?



Graduated Response

Assessing, understanding, and meeting the needs of children and young people with a social worker lies in:

- understanding the impact of issues that children with a social worker can experience
- offer targeted support to meet the needs
- recognise the value of engaging the child's voice in the process of identification and support

Pupil Premium



Using pupil premium: guidance for school leaders

February 2024

Supporting CWSW

Pupil premium guidance encourages education settings to design their pupil premium strategy to meet the needs of eligible pupils and others who may benefit

from extra support, such as children with a social worker.

It can be used:

- to support other pupils with identified needs, such as those who have or have had a social worker, or who act as a carer
- for whole class interventions which will also benefit non-disadvantaged pupils.

This means that you are able to utilise your PP funding to support other 'disadvantaged' children that may not currently be in receipt of PP, including your CWSW cohort.
