**PROPOSED CONVERSION OF FOOTWAY TO SHARED USE FOOTWAYS / CYCLE TRACKS
AT A428 LAWFORD ROAD, RUGBY**

Warwickshire County Council hereby proposes, pursuant to sections 65 and 66 of the Highways Act 1980, to convert parts of existing footways at A428 Lawford Road, Rugby (as described with approximate measurements in the Schedule below) into shared use footways/cycle tracks for use by pedestrians and cyclists at the toucan crossing.

A428 Lawford Road, Rugby

At the location of the proposed toucan crossing on A428 Lawford Road, near Lawford Bridge Close, Rugby:-

- approximately 9 metres of footway on the northern side of the toucan crossing and;
- approximately 12 metres of footway on the southern side of the toucan crossing.
