





About the library	
There are people who work at the library who I can talk to. They will be wearing a staff card around their neck to help me recognise them. They are very friendly.	
The library is usually a quiet place where people talk quietly, relax and read books.	
Sometimes it might be noisy. There might be an event with lots of people. People might be singing or talking. If it is noisy, I can talk to a member of staff, and they can help me find a quieter space to sit.

How I become a member of the library

I will talk to someone who works there to become a member of the library.	
I will tell them my name, address, date of birth, telephone number and email address. They will give me a list of rules to read about using the library. I must agree to follow those rules. If I'm aged under 16, the adult with me will do this for me.	









I will show them identification. This can be a driving licence, bank statement or household bill. If I'm aged under 16, the adult with me will do this for me.	PASSPORT

If I want to borrow a book, I will talk to a member of the library staff.	
The staff will show me how to borrow the book and tell me when I need to bring it back to the library. I can borrow up to 10 books for 3 weeks at a time.

The library will also have some computers. The computers are free to use if I have my library card and know my PIN number. If I'm aged under 16, I'll need to be with an adult to use the computers. My PIN number will be my date of birth as a long number – DDMMYYYY.	
To use the computers, I might need to wait for one to be	
available. If I need help, I can	
talk to a member of staff.	
I will need to pay a charge if I want to print from the	
computer.	
I can find out about events and activities in the local area. If I	
need help, I can talk to a member of staff.
