



I'm going to Stratford-upon-Avon Library

Before I go to the library I'm going to Stratford-upon-Avon library. If I am aged under 16 and need to join the library, I will need to take an adult with me to help me join. If I am aged under 8, I must have an adult with me any time I am in the library. If I am nervous about going, I can talk to someone and ask questions first. I can call 0300 555 8171 and ask to speak to someone at Stratford Library. I can ask the person for a tour of the library.









About the library	
There are people who work at the library who I can talk to. They will be wearing a staff card around their neck to help me recognise them. They are very friendly.	
The library is usually a quiet place where people talk quietly, relax, and read books.	
Sometimes it might be noisy. There might be an event with lots of people. People might be singing or talking. If it is noisy, I can talk to a member of staff, and they can help me find a quieter space to sit.	









How I become a member of the library

When I get to the library, I will see a desk.	
I will talk to someone who works there to become a member of the library.	
I will tell them my name, address, date of birth, telephone number and email address. They will give me a list of rules to read about using the library. I must agree to follow those rules. If I'm aged under 16, the adult with me will do this for me.

When I visit the library	
In the library there will be shelves of books.	
I can sit in a chair to read a book.

I can borrow a book and take it home with me.	
If I want to borrow a book, I will talk to a member of the library staff.	
The staff will show me how to borrow the book and tell me when I need to bring it back to the library. I can borrow up to 10 books for 3 weeks at a time.	
The library will also have some computers. The computers are free to use if I have my library card and know my PIN number. My PIN number will be my date of birth as a long number – DDMMYYYY. If I'm aged under 16, I'll need to be with an adult to use the computers.
