Summary of Brief:

Warwickshire Libraries is a National Portfolio Organisation (NPO), directly funded by Arts Council England (ACE), to deliver a range of programmes and activities. We are seeking an experienced creative practitioner/ organisation to deliver the Let's Make Digital & Arts Award commission.

This will include:

- Extending and developing the Warwickshire Libraries digital offer.
- Engaging with new and emerging digital arts and technology to support library staff and communities' digital creative skills, expanding our digital outreach and engagement.
- Delivering 6 workshops (2 at each library) in our Let's Make spaces at Leamington, Rugby, and Nuneaton Libraries, with appropriate technology targeting adults and 11 –17-year-olds. Each session will be held post 5pm during weekdays and during the day over weekends to engage a more diverse audience, with 10 participants per session. Please note the dates are currently to be identified; however, we expect delivery between August and November 2024.







- Training library staff to deliver these (or a version of these) sessions that can be delivered within the Let's Make spaces and during outreach engagements, by November 2024.
- Delivering 3 Arts Award (Explore/ Discover) sessions using Let's Make Digital for 11 –17-year-olds during August 2024 at Leamington, Rugby, and Nuneaton Libraries with 10 participants per session. Please note that provisional dates have been confirmed for the sessions. These sessions are being delivered in partnership with the Holiday Activities Fund (HAF).
- Delivering a minimum of 1 Arts Award (Explore/ Discover) session within a Let's Make space during the October Half-Term (Monday 28th October to Sunday 3rd November 2024) for 11 –17-year-olds, with 10 participants. Please note the date/ venue is TBC.
- Engaging new audiences, specifically young people, with Warwickshire Libraries.
- Supporting participants to build their confidence and understanding of digital technologies and the potential careers within the industry.
- Supporting Warwickshire Libraries to trial and develop an evening/ weekend Let's Make Digital offer.
- Creating a minimum of 2 x social media/ content outputs throughout the commission.
- Developing, where applicable, partnerships with local community groups, partners, and stakeholders to support the promotion and legacy of the commission through signposting to further opportunities.
- Supporting a change in attitudes towards libraries by reaching new and diverse communities.

The commission involves working in partnership with the Warwickshire Libraries NPO Team to:

- Support the delivery of the Arts Award (Explore/ Discover) sessions so that the young people who participate will gain an accredited qualification.
- Support the marketing and promotion of the sessions to reach diverse communities.
- Incorporate evaluation and data capture including photography and filming across the commission.
- Create a short film to capture the impact of the commission which can be shared on social media and with partners/ funders/ stakeholders.
- Identify potential funding and partnership opportunities to support the legacy of the Let's Make Digital programme.
- Adhere to Warwickshire County Council's photo/ filming permissions, GDPR guidance and, where appropriate, Risk Assessments.
- Promote and embed environmental responsibility throughout the commission, to reflect best practice in this area.
- Raise awareness of Warwickshire Libraries and their free services across the county.

Background Information

Warwickshire Libraries NPO

As the first library service in the West Midlands to become an NPO, Warwickshire Libraries is being funded directly by ACE from April 2023 to March 2027, with the opportunity to reapply at the end of the period. It is both an honour and an accolade to be awarded NPO status.

ACE describes NPOs as "leaders in their areas, with a collective responsibility to protect and develop our national arts and cultural ecology." The NPO investment provides funding to extend and enhance our arts, heritage and culture offer across the county, particularly focusing on areas of greater need.

Our overarching ambition is to grow and develop a high-quality cultural offer for, with and by the people of Warwickshire that delivers against County Council priorities, ACE's Let's Create strategy and four investment principles:

- Inclusivity and relevance
- Environmental responsibility
- Dynamism
- · Ambition and quality

In essence, the NPO is about making arts and culture more attractive and accessible to all Warwickshire residents, wherever they live, whatever their circumstances or previous levels of engagement.

The Warwickshire Libraries NPO will focus heavily on the Levelling Up agenda. The NPO team will support County Council ambitions towards narrowing gaps and creating equality of opportunity for all Warwickshire residents, with a particular emphasis on rural communities, young people, and those living in less advantaged







parts of the county. Of the 22 Warwickshire areas identified for Levelling Up, 17 are in the Nuneaton and Bedworth district.

Warwickshire Libraries

We have 18 council-run libraries, three mobile libraries and a Schools Library Service. In addition, Warwickshire Libraries has specialist reading and learning, digital and outreach teams, and a tablet lending scheme. We also support a vibrant network of 13 social enterprise libraries, and our services actively involve hundreds of volunteers. As part of the ambitious Transforming Nuneaton redevelopment scheme, Warwickshire Libraries was awarded capital investment to update our estate, technology and develop plans for a flagship Library and Business centre in the heart of the town.

The Warwickshire Libraries service is part of the British Library's Living Knowledge Network and has a crucial role to play in delivering the Warwickshire Waterways Strategy, as well as the Warwickshire Heritage and Culture Strategy 2020 – 2025.
