English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

Are you interested in improving your English? Would you like to get a job or a better job?

Do you want to feel more confident speaking to neighbours, teachers, doctors, people at work?

Our ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) course can help you.

Our Course can help with:

- Speaking and likening in everyday situations
- Reading in English (letters, brochures, emails, websites, other information)
- Writing in English (emails, messages, notes, letters etc)

Our friendly, qualified and experienced tutors will work with you to identify and achieve your goals. You will work in small groups to make sure you have plenty of opportunities to practise.

You can take a recognised qualification (Trinity Skills for Life) in reading, writing and speaking/listening exams. These will be available to you once you are ready to take them.

Once we have contacted you, we will arrange an assessment of your level to make sure you are allocated to the right class. Our classes are free and there is a charge for exams only. Remissions do apply for exams.

We offer a whole range of English and Maths courses that will help:

- Those who wish to further their career and need to upgrade qualifications
- Those looking to improve their job prospects
- Parents who need to help their children with homework

- Those whose first language is not English to gain a recognised English qualification or understand the language of maths
- To develop skills in budgeting your money
- To develop your confidence

Family Learning

Family Learning is learning that takes place among family members including parents, grandparents and carers. It's about discovering and exploring things together; learning in a relaxed atmosphere.

Why is it important?

It helps children develop essential skills and achieve at school. Family Learning can lead to improvements in children's behaviour and attainment. Children whose parents support their learning do better at school and in later life.

It has a positive impact on adults too...

It helps parents to reconnect to learning. It allows parents to find out how their children learn and understand how to support them better. Family learning offers a chance for adults to step back onto the learning ladder.

"When I first came on the REAL course, I felt nervous but the tutor was so positive and kind that I soon forgot my fears.

I learned so much on the course and I can now help my son develop his skills. I understand how important stories and rhymes are for his development, and we now love spending time together reading and singing.

How we are delivering our courses

Due to the risks of Covid-19 we are not running face-to-face classes from September 2020. Most courses are currently delivered via live online sessions, supported by email communication and other online resources. To access these you will need a computer, tablet or smartphone equipped with a camera, speakers and microphone. For more information please see the course details on our website. We will restart classes in our usual locations when it is safe to do so.

If you are interested in joining a class but not confident that you could access learning online, please contact us – we may be able to help you.

What will it cost?

English, Maths, Family Learning and some other classes are free to all learners. Where fees apply, we operate the following fee categories:

Full fee: You will pay this if you do not qualify for a discount.

Discount fee: This is the fee rate for learners aged 66 or over.

Fully remitted: This rate applies for learners, or their unwaged dependants, in receipt of one of the following benefits: Employment and Support Allowance, Housing/Council Tax Benefit (not single person's discount), Incapacity Benefit, Job Seekers Allowance, Pension Credit, Universal Credit, Income Support, Working Tax Credit (annual income below £16,385). Whilst delivery is online courses are free for this category. When we return to face-to-face delivery there will be a small resource charge for some arts and crafts courses.

Full details of the fees for each course can be found on our website.

For ESOL and some ICT courses, you may be eligible for a free course and exams if you are employed but earn less than £17,004 per year. Please ask for details.

Am I eligible?

We can only accept learners who are aged 19 or over on 31/08/2020. Most learners are required to have been permanently resident in the UK, the EU or EEA for the last 3 years. If you do not meet these criteria please contact us, as you might still be eligible.

We are not funded to work with learners living in the West Midlands Combined Authority area. If you pay your council tax to Coventry, Birmingham, Solihull, Walsall, Sandwell, Dudley or Wolverhampton we may not be able to enrol you, or different fee rates may apply. Please contact us for more information.
