Why does Market Hall Museum need my support?

Originally built to shelter stallholders for Warwick's regular market, it now houses an extensive collection highlighting Warwickshire's local history, from the infamous taxidermy bear at the main entrance to the extensive collection of locally found Roman coins. We are a free Museum run by Warwickshire County Council and welcome thousands of visitors every year including regular visits from members of the local community. On the premises we also have a thriving shop and café. We are looking for Retail Host Volunteers. This will be a great opportunity to meet new people and make friends, whilst also learning new skills in a retail environment and being part of an amazing team.

What will I be doing?

As a Retail Host Volunteer this will involve:

- Operating the shop till.

- An opportunity to assist in merchandising and creating shop displays.
- Answering any questions that visitors may have or directing them to a member of staff for further assistance.

How much time will I be expected to give?

We are looking for approachable, personable, good communicators, who have a positive attitude and enjoy engaging and communicating with visitors in a retail environment. Volunteers in this role may be required to stand for long periods time.

What support and training will I receive?

Full training will be provided which will include:

- Familiarisation with site and staff.
- Induction and health and safety training.
- Role-specific training.
- On-going monitoring and support from the site team.
- Familiarisation with the shop layout and its product lines.

- Enjoy your role and carry out the tasks to the best of your ability.
- Help us maintain the highest standards of presentation.
