The word MUSEUM is written across the front of the building.


There are signs outside the front door letting people know what they can come and do at the museum.

# When you come in








The Bear The Shop The Café

You don't have to walk through it to get into the museum.


# The Shop



This is our museum shop.


If you have a question, you can find a member of staff here who can help you.

# The First Gallery




The first gallery is about Warwickshire from 1836 to the present day.

You can also see our giant deer skeleton. His name is Oisin ("O-Sheen"). He is very old and fragile so don't touch him

Next to the Giant Deer, you can find our Explorer Backpacks. You can borrow one of these and a sketch book to take around the museum with you.

When you are leaving, put the things back into the backpack and return the backpack to the stand for the next person to use.

Bug-eye viewer Can you find it? cards




# The Cinema in the First Gallery

By pressing the button underneath the screen you can choose a film to watch.

To make the films start press the green button in the centre.

Some of the films have sound.

You have to watch the whole film you have chosen before you can start another one.



# The Activity Space



When we have a family activity happening, they usually take place on the ground floor in front of our cinema. Staff will be here to help you. You can do as much or as little as you like. It can get busy and noisy here.

# The Digital Screens

These screens are accessible labels. You can change the background colour of the screen to make it easier to read them, make the words larger or smaller or listen to the words if you prefer.

To make them work you touch the screen.


They are in every gallery of the museum.




# The Digital Screens

This screen takes you to our website called 'Our Warwickshire'. You can find lots of information about the history of Warwickshire here.

To make these screens work you have to touch the screen.

These tablets are in every gallery.

# The Downstairs Gallery



As you walk past the cinema, there is a speaker that will play music.

There are bags with scent cubes in that you can smell if you want to.





Some of the display have draws. You can open them to see what is inside.

#### The Lift to the First Floor



This is the door to the lift.



It opens outwards automatically when you press the button. You might have to wait a while though. It is a very slow lift. If you pull on the handle it won't open.

#### The Lift to the First Floor



To go up to the First Floor, you need to press and hold the button with 1 on it. You need to hold your finger on the button until you arrive at the next floor or the lift will stop. If it stops, press and hold it again and the lift will start moving again.

#### The Dig Touch Screen Game and Electronic Microscope





These interactives are located next to each other, on the ground floor, just to the left of the door to the upstairs galleries.

The Dig is a touch screen game where you use your fingers to choose tools to excavate layers of the past to find an object. It has sound effects throughout the game.

The electronic microscope lets you look up close at grains and sand. You can push the buttons to zoom in and out and focus the microscope. The screen shows you what you are looking at. You can't look down the microscope as there is a camera for the screen there instead.

#### The Door to the Stairs and Public Toilet



This the door to the stairs.



The door opens outwards when you press the button with the symbol for a wheelchair on it.

#### The Toilet





The toilet is located under the stairs.

The lights of the toilet come on automatically when you walk into the toilet. They are motion sensor lights and will stay on while you are in the toilet.






The hand dryer is to the right hand side of the door as you go in, opposite the sink and hand towels. It is noisy.


To the right of the toilet door as you go in there is a blue alarm box that people in the museum can talk to you through if you have pulled the red emergency cord or pressed the red button for help.

The stairs take you up to the upstairs galleries.


# Origins to Romans Gallery

They can't get to you in the museum though.




# **Duplo Dinosaurs**

This gallery tells you about Warwickshire from the Anglo-Saxon era to 1836.

It is quite dark. Next to the tapestry there is an automatic light that goes on and off when someone walks near it.

## **Dressing-Up Clothes**

These are for adults and children to try on. There's a mirror to see what you look like in the costume.

The dressing-up clothes are big enough to go on over your clothes.



#### Fabrics they are made from include:

- Silk effect fabric
- Silk embroidery
- Brocade fabrics with relief patterns you
   can feel with your fingers

- Cotton and polycotton
- Wool
- Velvet
- Upholstery fabrics with relief patterns you can feel with your fingers

#### The Music Box

Turn the wheel on the left of the box to make the bells play a tune.

You can change the tune by moving the levers on the box.

It is a very noisy music box.



# Toy and Book Corner

On the carpet in the corner of the Anglo Saxon—1836 Gallery there are boxes with toys, puzzles and books in.

You can play with the toys and read the books.



#### The First Museum





This is a small room off the Anglo Saxons - 1836 gallery with lots of interesting things to see.

#### The First Museum

There is a recreation of Reverend Brodie's Study. You can sit at the desk, open the draws and look at the things on the desk. You can try on the coat and hat that are on the coat stand.

There are some background noises playing quietly.


If you need a break, you can come in here and close the door.



# Leaving the Museum

When you are ready to go, head back down the stairs or down in the lift and leave through the same door you came in by.

# If we all need to leave the building quickly

An alarm bell will ring and a member of staff will come to make sure you are leaving the building.

Walk calmly and quickly.

Leave the museum by the door you came in or out of our back door. It will be bolted from the inside, just unbolt the door and go outside. This will cause another loud alarm to go off so we know someone has opened the door.

Do not use the lift.

If you can't get down the stairs press the refuge alarm button, on the upstairs landing, for assistance. It's on a green panel.
