Dating from c.1939, it lists members of Doreen's family (including herself), and what she intends to purchase for each of them. As we can see, Doreen had ideas for some of her family members, such as her "Pa" (who we believe was her father-in-law Arthur Fitzherbert Wright), who was to receive a "super overcoat", which everyone was contributing to. Some family members, like Bill

and Mary, both have slightly more vague suggestions of "something wheeled" and "something girlish" respectively. Nick, Bill and Mary are the children of Doreen and Gilbert. However, poor Rosamund and Ida have question marks next to their names, so they must have been a bit trickier to buy for<sup>1</sup>! Felix also has the 15<sup>th</sup> next to his name and after some genealogical research, we know that his birth was registered in the December quarter of 1935<sup>2</sup>, which means Doreen had a birthday present to purchase for him as well!

## Doreen Wright

Doreen Wright lived what appears to have been a fascinating life. She was a talented artist (some of her work has featured previously as Document of the Month) and swimmer. She competed in the first British Empire Games in 1930 with her sister Joyce<sup>3</sup>. Much more about Doreen's life can be found in the book called *Doreen's Diary: She Could Not Have Loved More*.

She is perhaps best known for her wartime diary, which is deposited here at the Record Office as part of the same collection as this document. The diary was started by Doreen after the news that her RAF pilot husband, Gilbert Francis Moncrieff Wright, was missing in action in 1940. It describes her life during the war whilst she was living with her parents-in-law at Wootton Court. It was intended by Doreen as a means for her to keep her husband updated on everything he had missed upon his return from active service. However tragically, this was not to be. According to the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, he is buried in Berneville Communal Cemetery in France<sup>4</sup>.

The diary was discovered amongst her effects by her family after she died in 2003, and transcribed and published in 2012 as part of a project called *Doreen's Diary: The Life of an Indomitable Woman in Warwickshire During*
