LOAN BOX SUBSCRIPTION SERVICE

Children will explore the effects and impact of the fire through the eyes of 'real-life' eyewitnesses. and step into their shoes to plead their case for compensation to Lord Brooke of Warwick Castle. Children will have to decide what they think is fair or unfair in their discussions.

The historical concept of cause and consequence is a key theme that runs through this workshop. The themes and issues have parallels with the 1666 Great Fire of London

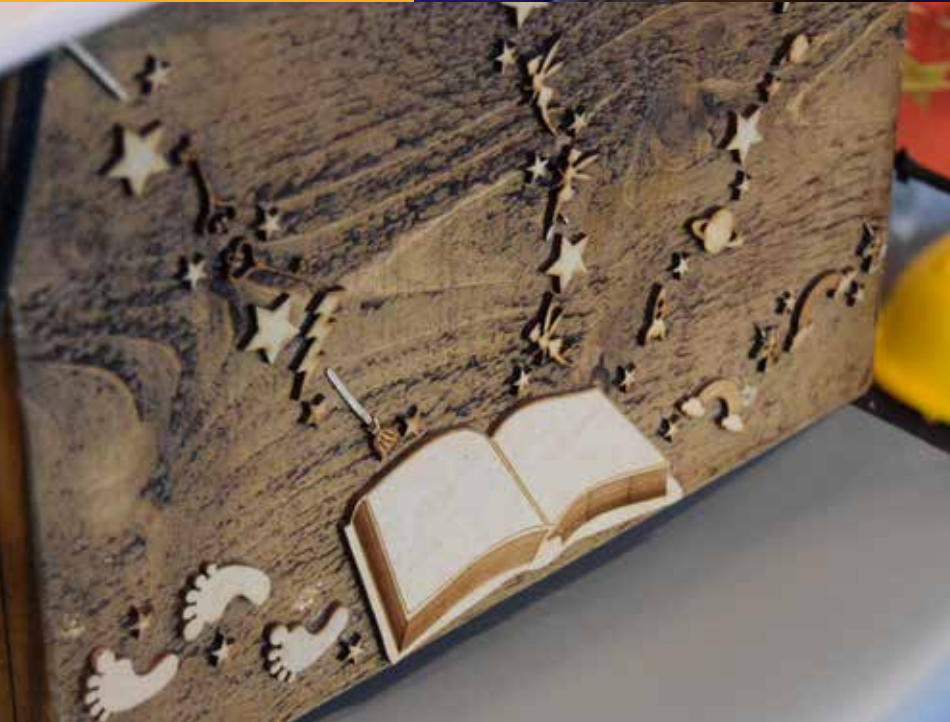

They will plan a journey using an ancient map of Egypt, practice hieroglyphs, barter in an Egyptian marketplace for provisions, explore Egyptian beliefs about the afterlife, examine original and replica artefacts, design a cartouche on papyrus and create an artefact out of air-drying clay to take home.

Discover a Jurassic seascape rich in fossils from 170 million years ago. Jurassic Warwickshire was covered by a shallow sea, so we can't promise dinosaurs, but we can guarantee that everyone will find at least one fossil to keep. Learn how fossils were formed before going hunting for fossils in a safe area.

Any fossils found can be taken back to school for sorting, classification and further study. Visit a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) that perfectly demonstrates the underlying structure of the area and the effects of geological forces. The Jurassic seabed layer where the fossils come from can be clearly seen here, underneath layers of rock.

We provide all the equipment needed for the workshop, including sample specimens to help students identify their own finds. All groups visiting the quarry must arrange personal accident insurance. Due to the seasonal risk of inclement weather and the exposed nature of the site, we advise this workshop is booked for the summer term.

A fantastic opportunity to handle real Jurassic fossils from Warwickshire's Jurassic seabed and see the fossils on display at Market Hall Museum.

As members of the Warwickshire Natural History and Archaeological Society, the children have to learn about the Jurassic fossils in the Market Hall Museum. Sir Everard Home, of the Geological Society, is coming to inspect the new museum at the Market Hall, and they need to impress him with their knowledge.

The workshop will explain how fossils are formed as part of the rock cycle before Mary Anning guides your class through a Jurassic fossil handling sessions, learning the names of fossils and what living creatures they used to be.

There will be the opportunity to observe the fossils on display at the Market Hall Museum and gather information to present Sir Everard Home at the end of the workshop.

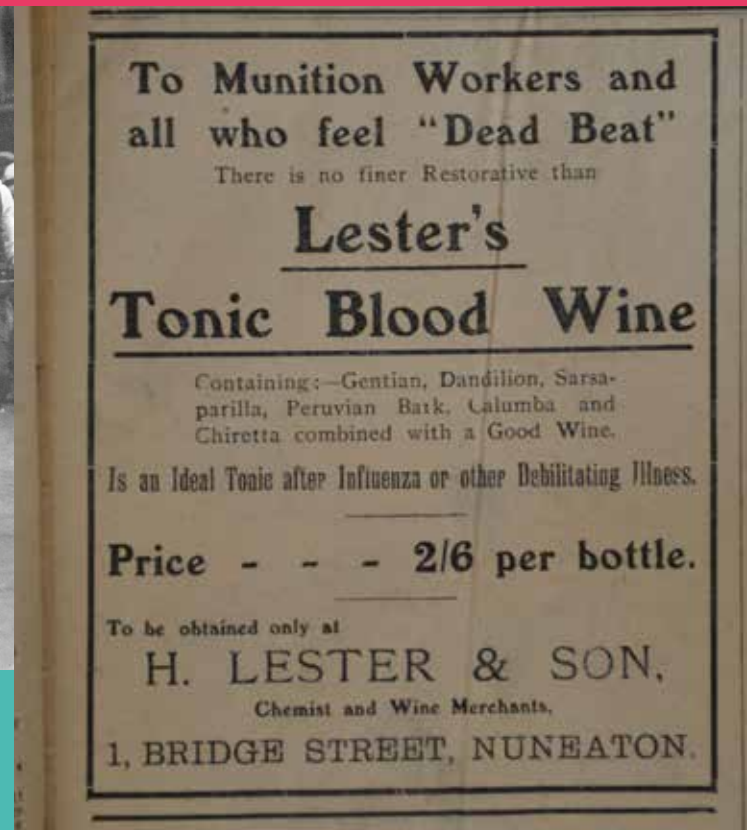

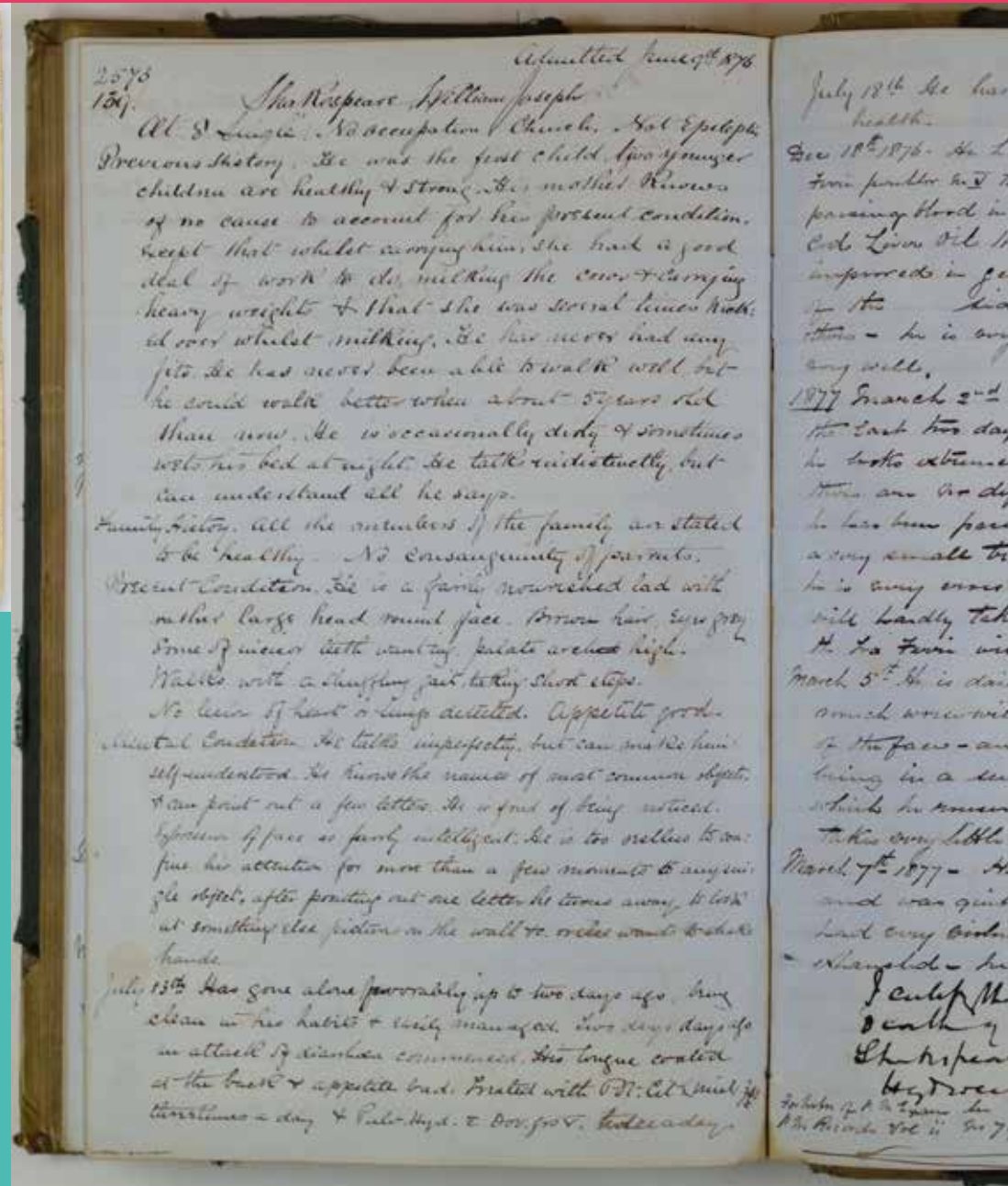
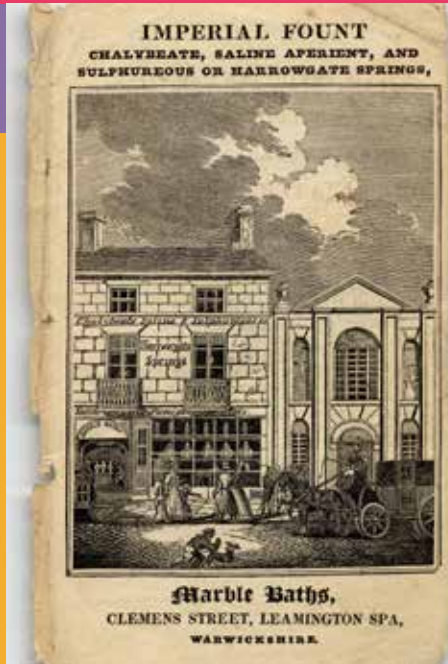
