New Business Grants

The government is introducing a new grant scheme to support businesses that are experiencing difficulties because of the Omicron variant, and the dual impact of staff absences and lower consumer demand. Click <u>here</u> for more information.

Statutory Sick Pay Rebate Scheme (SSPRS)

The government is reintroducing the Statutory Sick Pay Rebate Scheme (SSPRS). This will be a temporary scheme to support employers facing heightened levels of sickness absence due to COVID-19. The SSPRS will refund small and medium sized employers' COVID related SSP costs for up to two weeks per employee. For more information click <u>here</u>.

Helpful hints & tips!

What is the difference between capital and revenue funding?

For any businesses looking to apply for capital or revenue funding it is important to understand the difference between the two to ensure the application is completed accurately to give the setting the best chance at being successful in their bid.

Capital works

Capital works are usually a one-time purchase of a fixed asset that will be used over a long period of time. Capital expenditure can be used to acquire, upgrade, and maintain physical assets such as property, buildings, or equipment. **Revenue works**

Revenue works are usually the ongoing operating expenses which are short-term to run the daily business such as staff wages, rent, utilities etc.. Revenue expenditure also includes the ordinary repair and maintenance costs that are necessary to keep an asset in working order.

Early years initial teacher training: 2022 to 2023 funding guidance—Published 30.11.21— Funding guidance for early years initial teacher training (EYITT) providers for 2022 to 2023.

<u>Check if you can claim back Statutory Sick Pay paid to employees due to coronavirus (COVID-19)</u> - Updated 30.11.21—Added translation. Updated 21.12.21—This scheme will be reintroduced from mid-January 2022. Further guidance will be available as soon as possible.

<u>Return to your claim for the Self-Employment Income Support Scheme</u>—Updated 01.12.21— You can no longer update your bank details in the online service.

<u>NHS Test and Trace in the workplace</u>—Updated 01.12.21—Updated with guidance on Omicron variant. Updated 23.12.21—Updated to reflect changes to the self-isolation guidance.

<u>Early years initial teacher training (ITT) providers</u>—Updated 02.12.21—Updated the telephone number for UCL.

Actions for early years and childcare providers during the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak— Updated 02.12.21—Converted to HTML to improve accessibility. Added clarification on the use of face visors and face shields by those who are exempt from wearing face coverings and what guidance children and staff must follow when travelling to England from abroad. Updated 09.12.21—Following the Prime Ministers announcement on 8 December 2021, we have added guidance on working from home, the NHS COVID pass and parent and child groups. We have updated guidance on vaccination, vulnerable children and when to contact the NHS self-isolation hub, face coverings in communal areas, new and expectant mothers and individuals previously considered clinically vulnerable. Updated—06.01.22—Guidance updated in line with the UKHSA announcement about confirmatory PCR tests, clarification that children can return to the setting on day 7 if they've had 2 negative LFD tests and guidance on testing under 5s for household contacts.

Protective measures for holiday or after-school clubs and other out-of-school settings for children during the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak—Updated 02.12.21—Converted to HTML to improve accessibility and add clarification on the use of face visors and face shields by those who are exempt from wearing face coverings. Updated 09.12.21—Following the Prime Ministers announcement on 8 December 2021, we have updated guidance on asymptomatic testing, tracing close contacts and isolation, face coverings, workforce and the clinically extremely vulnerable. Updated 06.01.22—Guidance updated in line with the UKHSA announcement about confirmatory PCR tests, clarification that children can return to the setting on day 7 if they've had 2 negative LFD tests.

<u>Check a previous Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme claim</u>—Updated 02.12.21—Added information on 'If you've underpaid employees'.

<u>Pay Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme grants back</u>—Updated 02.12.21—Added section 'If you've not paid your employees enough'. Added further information about offsetting an amount you've overclaimed.

<u>Childcare and early years providers survey: 2021</u>—Published 09.12.21—Statistics on the characteristics of early years providers in England.

<u>Penalties for not telling HMRC about coronavirus (COVID-19) support scheme overpayments</u> <u>CC/FS11a</u>—Updated 10.12.21—The information on penalties has been updated and a new section about privacy has been added.

Early years inspection handbook-Updated 15.12.21-Please see 'Summary of changes'.

<u>Ask HMRC not to publish your Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme claim details</u>—Updated 15.12.21—You can no longer use this service. HMRC will not publish any new claims data after 16 December 2021.

<u>NHS Test and trace in the workplace</u>—Updated 15.12.21—Updated with advice for contacts who are not legal required to self-isolate to take 7 LFD tests. Removed legal requirements relating to contacts of someone infected with the Omicron variant.

<u>Managing coronavirus (COVID-19) in education and childcare settings</u>—Updated 15.12.21— Clarified the guidance on daily testing. Updated 07.01.22—Updated advice on face coverings and baseline measures.

<u>Pay Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme grants back</u>—Updated 16.12.21—New information added to 'If you find an error when filing your tax return' and 'Offset an amount you've over-claimed'. Updated 20.12.21—Added section 'If you need more time to work out what you ow-e'.

<u>Kickstart Scheme</u>—Updated 17.12.21—Updated page to say applications for Kickstart Scheme funding closed at midday on 17 December 2021.
