Low level concern /allegation against a member of staff or volunteer or childminder

Concerns logged on yellow form and passed to manager/setting leader

Manager considers if the concerns meet the threshold

- behaved in a way that has harmed a child, or may have harmed a child and/or
- possibly committed a criminal offence against or related to a child, and/or
- behaved towards a child or children in a way that indicates he or she may pose a risk of harm to children, and/or
- behaved or may have behaved in a way that indicates they may not be suitable to work with children

Manager/setting leader considers the information and the need for

Any doubt

- training either individual or as a team
- supervision
- re confirm the staff behaviour policy (code of conduct) clear expectations of appropriate behaviour
- empower reporting of low-level concerns

Low level concerns shared about agency staff and contractors should be shared with THEIR employer.

Encourage an environment where staff self-refer if they find themselves in a situation there could be considered to fall below expected professional standards.

Low level concerns about the manager should be followed up with the owner/ committee/ governors.
