Fire Safety Education Programme

StayWise: a free learning platform aimed at pupils aged 3 – 11. The nation's emergency services have teamed up with a range of national safety charities to produce a new website packed full of their collective safety education resources.

StayWise (www.Staywise.co.uk) brings together the educational resources of the emergency services linked to the national curriculum. That means pupils can learn about fire safety as part of a maths lesson or write a set of escape plan instructions in an English lesson.

The National Fire Chiefs Council (NFCC) leads the partnership behind StayWise. Partners include the Royal National Lifeboat Institution, HM Coastguard, the Association of Ambulance Chief Executives, the National Police Chiefs Council, Injury Minimisation Programme for Schools and the Royal Life Saving Society.

The site offers free lesson plans, videos, and activities to help educators teach young people about potentially lifesaving advice within core curriculum subjects.

First Aid

ProTrainings – A free online first aid course aimed at school-age children: “At ProTrainings, we believe that every school-aged child should learn basic first aid skills, but this is difficult and costly. Our answer is to offer a free video online course to all school-aged students in the UK where they can not only learn first aid skills but also learn how to use online training courses which will help improve their ICT skills. On the course, various first aid subjects are covered to encourage children to help someone in need but to also ensure that they keep themselves safe at all time and make sure that they get help.”

“This is open to Home Educated children. All our first aid courses fully meet the latest UK and European Resuscitation Council Guidelines 2021 as per the HSE requirements.”

4. Complete the final test and pass with an 80% or better (Your school's grading requirements may vary).
5. Complete the hands-on portion if your school is doing a blended First Aid course.
6. Print your Free Student First Aid (VTQ) card online upon course completion.

- research a subject that might not be available through other qualifications
- develop independent research and project management skills
- develop skills at Level 2 that will help with sixth form or college

- learn skills that will help in higher education or the workplace
- develop future employability skills

The Project allows students to carry out research on a topic that they have chosen and are interested in. Students can choose their own topic and research and develop it independently, with the support and guidance of a supervisor. If your child wishes to sit exams (i.e. GCSE's), you will need to enter them as a private candidate at an exam centre for the required exam board. Princes Trust run a 12-week programme in September, January and May which consists of meeting the group, writing contracts on how all members want to be treated, a 4-day residential for team building, fundraising within the community, community projects, work placements, mock interviews and CV writing, and building confidence within the community (supporting foodbanks, working with canal trust, work within elderly care homes etc). They advise that 3 out of 4 attendees move onto either volunteering, employment or further education. This is free of charge.
