

Reasons for Early Conversations

Our children are all different, this is not an exhaustive list!

- Cognition and Learning; progress or acquiring skills
- Relationships
- Emotional well-being
- Speech and language development
- Physical development
- Concentration/ attention/ tiredness
- Attendance
- Transitions





The Emotional Journey


The rollercoaster of emotions you are feeling is normal.

Take your time to process what is happening and be kind to yourself as you begin your journey as a parent carer.

The process of discovery is often a long-term thing — you will want quick answers but unfortunately the system doesn't support that — don't expect to be an expert in all things SEND right now.

Top tips:

- Get a notebook and record every meeting, discussion and observation with dates
- Get a folder to keep all the paperwork you receive
- Build your support network peer support is invaluable
- Join Warwickshire Parent Carer Voice so that your experiences can be included











Accessing Support through your GP or Health Visitor -

What to take with you:

- Your child, Depending on the child, their personal circumstances, and the type of appointment it may be useful for us to talk directly to your child.
- Any related documents, school reports, diaries, reports from any professional involved.
- **Examples**, try and think logically of the issues your child faces and have examples.







What to expect:

- You know your child best; your GP may have never met them before so will be led by you and your concerns.
- School is best placed to access support and help from OT, Educational psychology, Specialist teachers etc
- Utilise RISE support and dimensions toolkit help to build the picture for school.
- A GP cannot make a diagnosis but may help to recognise if there is a mental health issue or neuro development issue and guide referrals- often there is overlap.
- **CAMHS waiting lists** are unfortunately overwhelmed. We can't make this better and everyone wants a supporting letter.
- A lack of diagnosis doesn't mean you cannot access support.





Raising your concerns: The Graduated Response

The SEND Information and Advice Service (SENDIAS) can offer advice and support (please see link at end)

Step 1

Class teacher/ subject teacher/ form tutor/ pastoral lead

Step 2

- SENDCo/Inclusion Manager
- Step 3
- Outside agencies





Outside Agencies:

- Educational Psychologists
- Specialist Teachers e.g., Integrated Disability Service (IDS), Specialist Teaching Service (STS)
- Flex Learning Team
- Occupational Therapy (OT)
- Speech and Language Therapy
- Significant Adults
- Ethnic Minorities and Traveller Achievement Service (EMTAS)





The school website

The school website should include:

- SEND Information Report
- SEND Policy
- Behaviour Policy
- Accessibility Policy and Plan
- Link to WCC Local Offer
- Dimensions Tool
- Neuro Developmental Pathway e-booklet





SEND Information Report should include:

Everything a parent, carer or student could want to know in terms of SEND identification, provision and support

- Details of and links to the area Local Offer
- The name and contact details of the SENCO.
- Information about the expertise and training of staff in relation to children and young people with SEN and about how specialist expertise will be secured.
- What interventions are implemented and their impact.
- The additional learning opportunities for pupils with SEN.





- Procedures for the identification and assessment of pupils with SEN.
- Approach to teaching pupils who have SEN.
- How the school enables pupils with SEN to engage in the activities of the school together with children who do not have SEN.
- Details of the support that is available for improving the social, emotional and mental health and development of pupils with SEND.
 - How pupils and their parents are involved in decision-making.
 - How school evaluates the effectiveness of your provision, including securing feedback and the views of pupils and their parents.





How will the staff at Lapworth Primary School and Little Oaks Preschool know if my child needs extra help?	In many cases, children join us with their needs already assessed. All children are assessed when they enter our school, so that we can build upon their prior learning. Children are assessed regularly throughout the term and their progress is tracked through termly Pupil Progress Meetings involving the class teacher and members of the senior leadership team.	Lapworth Primary School and Little Oaks Preschool work closely with a number of outside agencies, seeking their advice and guidance where required. These agencies include the Educational Psychology Service (EPS), Specialist Teaching Service (STS), Speech and Language Therapy (SLT) and Occupational Therapy (OT).			
		Behaviours which are observed by all members of staff. Use of behaviour monitoring systems such the behaviour ladder and individual behaviour plans.	Monitoring of progress - children whose progress is below expected will be identified.	Observed behaviours by members of staff which are logged in the class behaviour files.	Discussions with professionals such as the Occupational Therapist (OT).
What should I do if I think my child may have a special educational need or disability?	The school and preschool works closely with parents in the support of children. We encourage an active partnership through an on-going dialogue with parents. We encourage parents to be part of their children's learning journey and therefore if you may have any concerns we would encourage you to first contact the class teachers. Alternatively you may wish to book an appointment with the SENCo or Headteacher. This can be done by contacting the school office to book an appointment.			I




