# What do we mean by Speech Language and Communication Needs (SLCN)?

Speech, language and communication needs (SLCN) is the term given to describe the extensive range of needs related to all aspects of communication – from understanding others to forming sounds, words and sentences to expressing ideas and emotions and using language socially





# **Children with SLCN may:**

- have difficulty in understanding information conveyed through spoken language
- have difficulty in communicating their needs, wants, thoughts and ideas to other people
- not understand the basic concepts of communication and that they can impart information or impact on the behaviours of others.
- find it hard to understand and/or use words in context
- use words incorrectly with inappropriate grammatical patterns
- have a reduced vocabulary
- find it hard to recall words and express ideas
- have speech and language skills that are significantly behind their peers
- have speech that is difficult to understand

#### Prevalence

- SLCN is the most common disorder seen in childhood (around 10% of all children)
- In some areas of social disadvantage this can rise to 50% of children entering school
- 7% of children will have persistent long term SLCN
- SLCN can limit:
  - o participation in education and social engagement
  - $\circ$   $\,$  long term mental and physical health  $\,$
  - $\circ$  employability





• The 10% can be divided into 3 groups:







# Who supports children with SLCN

In 2008 John Bercow (MP) commissioned a national review of provision for children with SLCN. The review recognised that SLCN is everyone's business and we all need to play a part

- Parents and carers
- Speech and Language Therapy
- Health visitors
- Early Years Setting
- Schools and Colleges
- School Nurses
- Educational Psychologists
- Specialist Teaching Service
- Integrated Disability Service
- The wider children's workforce
- Commissioners





#### SALT

- Open referrals (provided we have parents consent)
- Graduated response for children with 'language needs' (**not** for speech, dysfluency, voice, complex medical conditions, hearing impairment, cleft etc.)
- Children access care pathways related to their specific need (e.g. language, speech, voice
- Children supported through Universal, Targeted and Specialist model

# What is happening to review services?

- What made you start the review? 2 main reasons. Coventry and Warwickshire CCG's (now called ICB's) had joined together and we wanted to understand the differences between the 2 areas. This became more important when Warwickshire County Council and Coventry and Warwickshire CCG received a Written Statement of Action (WSOA). While the WSOA wasn't around SLCN specifically and more related to autism pathways, this provided another opportunity.
- What's happened so far? so far we have been collating information on what services are providing and identifying were there could be improvements. We have also been speaking with a range of people to get their opinion.
- When will know the results? we hope to have written up some preliminary recommends around SLCN and autism by September. We will then be looking to join with the Coventry project to identify what recommendations need to across Coventry and Warwickshire and what is needed that could be different in each area. We hope to have this ready by Christmas
- What will our feedback be used for? we will be looking to incorporate this into our paper and identify areas where parents and carers feel more support is needed.
