


GOOGLE 2-STEP VERIFICATION – APPLICATION SPECIFIC PASSWORDS


Application specific passwords are used to allow other applications to access your account when 2-step verification is enabled. As these applications cannot prompt for a verification code, only a username and password, an App-specific password can be created to allow access to your account from these applications.

Select 'My Account' from a Google screen, click 'Sign-in & security' then click 'Signing in to Google', followed by the 'App Passwords' button.




You may be asked to re-enter your password at this stage.

In the following screen, select the application and the type of device, then click 'Generate'



A password will then be displayed, either copy this or make a note of the password then follow the instructions contained in the 'How to use it' section (DO NOT USE THE PASSWORD DISPLAYED IN THE SCREENSHOT BELOW). Click 'Done'

How to use it

1. Open "Settings" on your iPad.
2. Select "Mail, Contacts, Calendars".
3. Select your Google Account from the list of available accounts.
4. Edit your account information and replace your password with the 16-character password shown above.


Just like your normal password, this app password grants complete access to your Google Account. You won't need to remember it, so don't write it down or share it with anyone.

NB You do not need to remember the app-specific password as it will not be needed again, once verified the application will be able to access your Google Apps account.

Generated passwords can be revoked at any time by clicking on the 'Revoke' button to the right of the name of the application used when creating the password. This will prevent the application from accessing your Google Apps account.
