

Briefing Sheet (Monday 16th October 2017)

Activities (including future plans)

The CRC Team at Nuneaton Justice Centre received WRAP training on 4th October and instantly identified two clients they are working with to refer to Channel.

Warwick District Council WRAP training is ongoing with their teams of frontline staff.

Feedback from the Nuneaton Community was fed into the Prevent Strategy Group that communities are unsure as to where to find the Channel referral form. A blog has been released to communities through the SafeinWarwickshire website, facebook and twitter pages with information about Channel and a link to the referral form, explaining how to make a referral and the process around that. A focus group on Channel has been requested by a community group in Nuneaton and a session explaining Channel and referrals will be arranged.

AG & SS continued their awareness sessions to Police frontline staff on 04/10 with a presentation on the most common cyber crime issues faced by Warwickshire residents delivered to **Warwick SNT**.

AG presented a cyber safety session to **Rugby BID** on 04/10, focussing on the most prevalent forms of online financial fraud. Other local BID groups will be presented to in the coming weeks.

From 3rd - 7th October, SS visited libraries across the county to provide advice and materials to locals around cyber safety as part of **Get Online Week**. Stockingford, Rugby, Polesworth and Stratford libraries were visited for this. Over 80 people were engaged with and were given resources. SS was also accompanied by a cyber champion for the Stratford drop in.



AG began the delivery of the Cyber Crime Advisors' Youth Champions programme to the **South Warwickshire Police Cadets** on 05/10. The first session covered financial cyber crime, with a second session covering social media safety to follow. North Warwickshire Cadets will also be trained as Cyber Champions.

SS continued delivering **Cyber Youth Champions Sessions to Wellesbourne Youth Services**. The content was based around Sexting, Sextortion and Social Media. The sessions will be reviewed to discuss their effectiveness.

SS attended the **Warwickshire Youth Parliament** to discuss the subject of cyber crime. The role of the advisers and projects ongoing in Warwickshire were explained as well as how cyber crime affects Warwickshire residents. Lots of questions were asked and opportunities to work with the parliament will continue after the session.

KW attended the south **Emerging Trends** meeting. Lots of discussion on trends in burglary and vehicle crime. Roadshows will now be planned to deliver crime prevention messages in hotspot locations. (see below)

Road Show is being arranged for both Milverton and Whitnash areas in the wake of the vehicle crime spike of the recent weeks. The first event will be held in Milverton w/c 16th October and will involve Warwickshire police (PC Andy WHISTON) (KW, PL)

Work with Allotment Watch is continuing in Kenilworth, Cubbington & Whitnash. Additional signage has been supplied along with shed-burglary packs that include shed-alarms, tamper-proof, labels and property marking kits. (PL)

PL will be making a presentation to the Learning Disability Partnership Board at the Sydni Centre in respect of the ongoing Safe Place Scheme. This will include an update on Safe Place maintenance, visits and ECINS audit trails.

PL will be making a presentation at the North Leamington Community Forum at Leamington Town Hall. The focus of the presentation will be on vehicle crime and home security.



CC did a presentation on personal security and crime prevention to the Wednesday club at **Dordon** Village Hall with PCSO Simeon Hodson. Over 70 people attended, many elderly, some who live on their own. Awareness packs were provided with property marking pens and advice given on further security equipment available through Neighbourhood Watch. CC has arranged for the group to have further presentations from our cyber team (SS & AG) and the fire service.

Feedback from Meetings, Courses and Conferences Attended

The PCC attended the Mid-Warwickshire Neighbourhood Watch Quarterly Meeting at the CJC Leamington Spa. The high levels of serious acquisitive crime were discussed (specifically vehicle crime and burglary dwelling). There were also discussions around the falling number of active NHW members and those prepared to even attend NHW meetings. (PL) Committee members questioned whether continuing to hold meetings was tenable.

CC attended the second county **fly tipping** meeting at Packington Hall, arranged by the **NFU**, which consisted of representatives from local authorities in Warwickshire plus Solihull. MPs Caroline Spelman and Craig Tracey also attended with representatives from fire, NFU and the local farming community. A terms of reference was agreed and an update on previous actions made.

CC met with representatives from **Leicestershire** to advise them on how the Warwickshire rural meetings are run and shared best practice on the **Warwickshire Rural Crime Project** and **Warwickshire Rural Watch scheme**.
