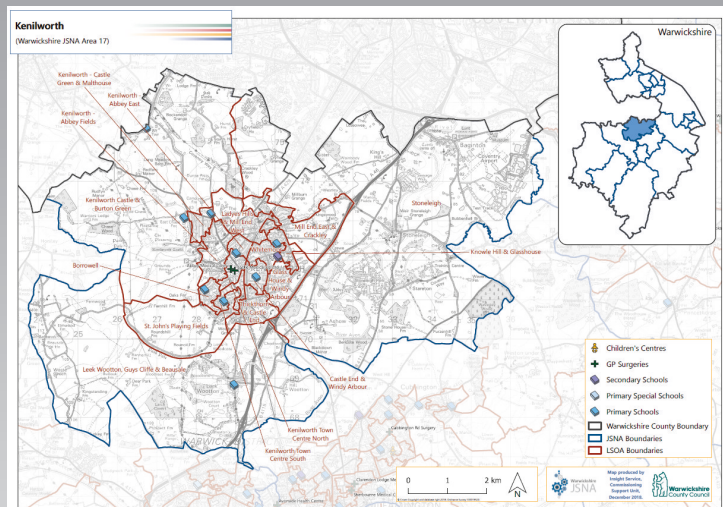
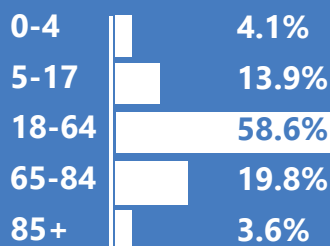

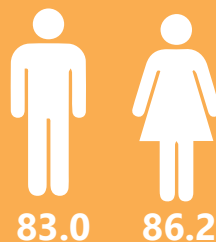


Age Profile
