The Savings Challenge:

- Reducing Children & Families Service Budget by just over £9 Million by 2020
- Invest to Save as an alternative to cuts
- Nearly £1million spent less on placements last year
- Nearly £2million additional money allocated to Children's Services next year
- Budget pressures largely agreed including
 - FGC, LADO and Missing Children's Practitioners
- DSG replaced with core funding for Parenting and Family Support







The Transformation Challenge –

- Numbers of CLA going up again, but: nearly 100 fewer coming into care than previous 3 years – we are still the best performers in the region
- Children's Centres agreed as part of our One Team strategy
- Partnership Board set up
- One Team will bring together all of our services
- Straight forward local conversations will provide an opportunity to smooth pathways for children and families
- Co-location will encourage multi-disciplinary working
- Caseloads reduced from 29 average to 19 average





Inspection and Peer Review

March 2017 – Peer Review CLA raises the profile of Children's Services and helps the corporate centre get "inspection ready" May 2017 – Ofsted!!! November 2017 – Peer Review of Early Help

Key messages:

We get a lot of things right, we have good staff, we know our children and families <u>but</u>

pace!







Being ahead of the game!

- We are the only the 7th Regional Adoption Agency in the Country and have made a great start
- Delivering the House Project will give us a great new way of empowering care leavers to take charge of their lives and help others to do the same
- Taking the Mocking Bird model forward will greatly improve the support for our in-house carers
- Frontline and Social Care apprentices as part of the Career Pathway in Social Care and Family Support will address remaining staff shortages and retention issues

Some unfinished business too

- Delivering the Ofsted action plan to be "good" by the the summer of 2018
- Responding to increases in demand:
 - Significant rises in CP plans
 - Maintaining a declining CLA trend despite regional increases
 - Rising referrals and open cases
- Securing placements in the context of declining residential and external placement offers and a competitive fostering recruitment market
- Responding to new legislation and guidance, including a new offer to care leavers and strengthened corporate parenting requirements
