
JSNA Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) Profile NHS Coventry & Rugby CCG





Coventry and Rugby CCG has a slightly younger age profile than can be found both in Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole and nationally. Its total future population growth is driven by increasing birth rates, rather an aging population, and its projected growth to 2035 is higher than that expected in Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole and nationally. This raises challenges with maternity and health visiting services, as well as childcare sufficiency and school place sufficiency. Comparisons are with Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole and nationally/Right Care Benchmark unless otherwise stated.

Areas of focus for Coventry and Rugby CCG should be to understand why there are much higher potential years of life lost from causes considerable amenable to health care, higher rates of child mortality, higher rates of 0-4 years A&E attendance, higher rates of emergency hospital admissions for self-harm, higher rates of self-harm related hospital admissions for 10-24 year olds, higher ratio of premature mortality from cancer aged under 75 years than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole, higher rates of smoking attributable mortality in those aged 35 years+ than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole, higher rates of under 18 conceptions than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole, higher excess winter mortality and higher rates of hip fractures in those aged 60 years+. Future commissioning should seek to address their causes.

- Higher rate of self-harm related hospital admissions for 10-24 year olds
- Lower prevalence of dementia than the Right Care Benchmark
- Higher rate of dementia related deaths amongst those aged 65 years+ than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole but lower than the Right Care Benchmark
- Lower rate of detection of new cases of cancer
- Lower prevalence of cancer
- Lower rate of emergency admissions with cancer than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole
- Higher ratio of premature mortality from cancer aged < 75 than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole
- Lower prevalence of CHD
- Lower prevalence of strokes
- Higher rate of CVD mortality than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole but lower than the Right Care Benchmark

- Lower prevalence of obesity in those aged 16 years+ than the Right Care Benchmark
- Higher prevalence of smoking than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole but lower than the Right Care Benchmark
- Higher rate of smoking attributable mortality in those aged 35 years+ than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole
- More mothers smoking at time of delivery than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole but fewer than the Right Care Benchmark
- Higher rate of alcohol related mortality than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole but lower than the Right Care Benchmark
- Higher rate of alcohol related conditions hospital admissions
- Higher rate of emergency admissions for alcohol related liver disease than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole but lower than the Right Care Benchmark
- Lower rate of admissions due to substance misuse amongst those aged 15-24 years
- Higher numbers of GP patients with caring responsibilities than the Right Care Benchmark but lower than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole
- More carers in 'bad' or 'very bad' health compared with Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole
- Higher rate of under 18 conceptions than Coventry
 Warwickshire as a whole
- Lower rate of breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks than the Right Care Benchmark but higher than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole
- Lower excess risk of mortality in people with diabetes
- Higher excess winter mortality
- Higher rate of hip fractures in those aged 60 years+
- Lower prevalence of rheumatoid arthritis
