Performing better/worse versus Coventry & Warwickshire
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Warwickshire North CCG has an older age profile and its 65 years+ population size is significantly larger than that of both Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole and nationally. Its total future population growth is significantly lower but its 65 years+ and 85 years+ population's growth will be significantly higher than that of both Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole and nationally by 2020. This raises a considerable financial challenge with fewer working age people in the CCG area and increased adult health and social care responsibilities associated with an aging population. Comparisons are with Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole and nationally.

Areas of focus for Warwickshire North CCG should be to understand why there are higher rates of 0-4 years A&E attendance, higher rates of mortality for adults with serious mental health issues, higher rates of emergency hospital admissions for self-harm, higher rates of dementia related deaths amongst those aged 65 years+, higher rates of CVD mortality, higher rates of admissions due to substance misuse amongst those aged 15-24 years, lower rates of breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks, higher prevalence of diabetes and higher rates of hip fractures in those aged 60 years+.

- More densely populated
- Less deprived overall, and for both children and older people
- Both male & female residents are expected to have shorter life expectancy
- Higher potential years of life lost from causes considerable amenable to health care than nationally
- Significantly higher rates of children looked after
- For 'disadvantaged' pupils lower attainment at Key Stage 2 & a wider attainment gap at Key Stage 4
- Lower rate of child mortality
- Higher rate of children killed or seriously injured in road traffic accidents
- Higher rate of 0-4 years A&E attendance

   Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole but lower than the Right Care Benchmark
- Lower prevalence of CHD than the Right Care Benchmark
- Lower prevalence of strokes than the Right Care Benchmark
- Higher rate of CVD mortality
- Higher percentage of excess weight in adults compared with Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole

- Higher prevalence of obesity in those aged 16 years+ than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole but lower than the Right Care Benchmark
- Higher percentage of overweight children in Reception compared with Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole
- Higher percentage of overweight children in Year 6 compared with Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole
- Higher prevalence of smoking than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole
- Higher rate of smoking attributable mortality in those aged 35 years+ than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole
- More mothers smoking at time of delivery than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole but lower than the Right Care Benchmark
- Lower rate of alcohol related mortality
- Higher rate of alcohol related conditions hospital admissions than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole but lower than the Right Care Benchmark
- Lower rate of emergency admissions for alcohol related liver disease
- Higher rate of admissions due to substance misuse amongst those aged 15-24 years
- Higher numbers of GP patients with caring responsibility
- More carers in 'bad' or 'very bad' health compared with Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole
- Higher rate of under 18 conceptions than Coventry & Warwickshire as a whole
- Lower rate of breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks
