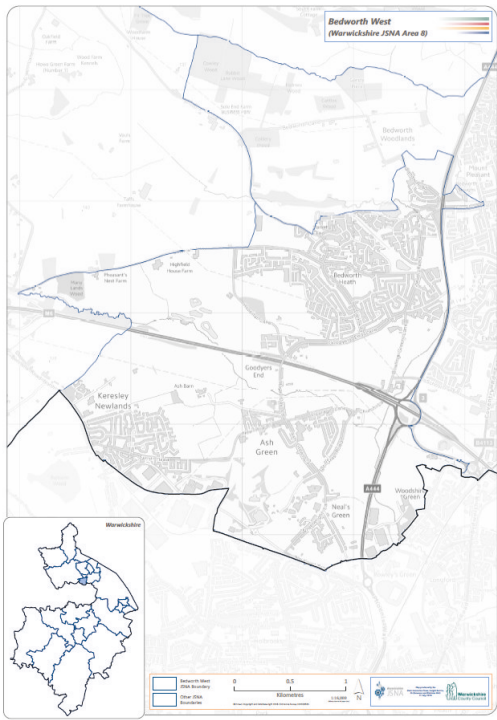

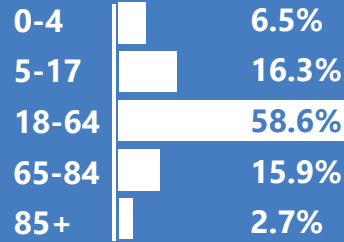

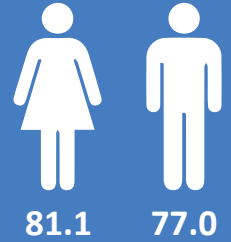

practices in 2017/18

Between 2014/15 & 2017/18,

of pupils were eligible for and claiming a Free School Meal in 2018, similar to the borough (12.4%) but above the county (9.0%) average
