Thank you for consulting the WSC LAF on the following proposed Traffic Order:

The Metropolitan Borough of Solihull (Hampton in Arden Village (Total Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 2025.

Having discussed with our member, Councillor Roger Waring, we register approval of the proposals. While wishing the proposals could go further to alleviate dangerous parking issues in some areas of Hampton-in-Arden we realise that a consensus of views must be taken into consideration. The WSC LAF therefore welcomes the measures SMBC proposes to take.

The village has been subjected to huge increases in traffic during the long M42 upgrades and expects worse from the planned Motorway Services Area. HS2 continues to negatively impact the lower end of the village and will do so for many years to come. In all, Hampton-in-Arden has suffered more than its fair share of disruption and road safety issues from all of the above with little possibility of respite for a long time. Unacceptable and potentially dangerous parking issues have exacerbated the situation.

The Warwickshire Solihull and Coventry Local Access Forum welcomes the measures SMBC Highways is proposing in the above Traffic Order - TPOW - ROW - March 2024 - Proposal.
