Frequently asked questions

Q. Some of the items I want to get rid of are still in good condition, can they be re-used?

A. All our centres have re-use shops, which allow you to donate and purchase re-usable items. Over 500 tonnes of reusable items are sold each year and the profits raised are used to help local charitable organisations. Most items are welcome if in good condition and safe to use; check with the shop on site if they'd like your items. For example; bikes, furniture, gardening equipment, bric-a-brac, sports equipment and working electrical items.

Q. Can I dispose of unwanted chemicals at the centres?

A. Chemicals, such as paint, pesticides, weed killers, preservatives, antifreeze and brake fluid, can be disposed of in small quantities at Lower House Farm and Princes Drive on designated days. You will need to complete a chemical waste form BEFORE you visit. The form and further information can be found at; www.warwickshire.gov.uk/chemicalwaste

Q. Can I dispose of DIY waste from my home or garden?

A. DIY waste such as soil, tiles, bricks etc can be disposed of in small quantities. We accept a maximum limit of 3 x 25kg bags per household per month. We also accept plasteboard at a maximum of 3 sheets per household per month.

Q. Can I use a Van, Pick-up-Truck or Trailer?

A. Vehicle restrictions apply to these types of vehicles, for more details visit www.warwickshire.gov.uk/licenceandpermits

Q. I need a bulky item collecting?

A. There are a number of re-use charities that may be able to accept, and perhaps even collect, your item. Please visit www.warwickshire.gov.uk/reuseschemes for details. Alternatively your local district or borough Council can provide a bulky waste collection for a fee. Please visit www.warwickshire.gov.uk/bulkywaste for more information.

Q. Can I take anything away from the centres?

A. You are not permitted to remove any items from the centres for any purpose, unless purchasing an item from the re-use shop.

Q. What items can I recycle at home?

A. Your local district or borough council is responsible for the collection of waste and recycling from your home. To find out what you can recycle at home visit **www.warwickshire.gov.uk/kerbside**

Q. What happens to the items sent for recycling?

If you would like to find out what happens to the recycling from the recycling centres then please visit our website to find out the current recycling routes for all our materials: www.warwickshire.gov.uk/whereitgoes. Any waste that cannot be recycled will be sent either to landfill or an energy from waste plant.

Q. How can I dispose of pet bedding from domestic pets?

A. Bedding or sawdust from herbivorous pets such as rabbits and guinea pigs can be composted at home in your compost bin or by putting it in your green food and garden waste wheeled bin. **Please note:** Only waste from domestic pets is accepted i.e. no waste from commercially bred animals.

Using the site

During your visit, please comply with the following site rules;

- Sort your rubbish at home before you visit, ready for recycling;
- Place all items in the correct containers at the site:
- Co-operate with members of staff; and ask for assistance if needed;
- Black bags may be opened by staff, and you may also be asked to sort and recycle any mixed bags of waste. Recycle as much as you can;
- For your own safety, walking into the site is not permitted;
- Keep all children and animals inside your vehicle;

- Do not exceed the 5mph speed limit;
- Treat all staff and other customers courteously;
- Be careful not to overfill your bags with items which are too heavy for you to lift;
- Any waste that cannot be recycled will be sent either to landfill or an energy from waste plant;
- Comply with all policies such as vehicle and DIY waste restrictions: and
- If you have commercial waste, you will be asked to pay the relevant fee. See below.
