
The COVID-19 Vaccine



The COVID-19 vaccine is an injection.




You will need 2 injections.

The vaccine doesn't stop everyone getting COVID-19.




If you do still get COVID-19 it shouldn't make you as poorly if you have had the vaccine.

have the vaccine?




The vaccine cannot give you COVID-19.




The vaccine will reduce your chance of becoming very ill.



We do not know whether it will stop you from getting COVID-19.




We do not know whether it will stop you passing on COVID-19.



The vaccine should reduce the risk of you getting COVID-19.


Does the COVID-19 vaccine cause side effects?




Some people get side effects.




Like all medicine, vaccines can cause side effects.




Most of these are mild and don't last long.

If you have side effects after the first injection,




You still need to have the second injection.


Can you catch COVID-19 from the vaccine?




You cannot catch COVID-19 from the vaccine.




The COVID-19 vaccine helps the body's immune system.



It makes the body produce its own protection against the virus.




This will help to protect you against COVID-19 in the future.




None of the ingredients in the vaccine can give you COVID-19.

No.




The vaccine does not change your DNA.




It is ok to have the vaccine.

There is no patent for the virus that causes COVID-19.




Posts on social media say Bill Gates is a partner in the lab in Wuhan, China.

There is no evidence to suggest that COVID-19 vaccines will affect you getting pregnant.




Claims of any effect of COVID-19 vaccination on fertility are not true.

Yes, the COVID-19 vaccines were developed quickly.




But the clinical trials were not rushed.




The clinical trials examine safety and effectiveness.



Safety was not compromised in any way.



COVID-19 is similar to other Coronaviruses we have seen in humans.




For example, MERS and SARS.



There was already research that could be used to speed up the process.

Can you get COVID-19 from the vaccines?



No.




There is no live virus in the vaccine.




So the vaccine can't infect you.

I've already had COVID-19, do I still need the vaccine?



Yes.




The Centre for Disease Control recommends that those who have had COVID-19 still need the vaccine.



There is evidence that the vaccine gives you better protection than having the virus.



If you have tested positive for COVID-19 you must wait 28 days from having symptoms before receiving the vaccine.




This is because the vaccine won't work as well if you have the vaccine during this time.



This is to ensure you get the best immunity.


Do I still need to wear a mask and social distance after having the vaccine?



Yes.




The government said if you have the vaccine,




You still need to social distance,

This is because we don't know if having the vaccine stops you passing on the virus.




So you could still infect others.


What should I do if I am not well when it is my next appointment?

You should have it as soon as possible.




You can call the same number you used to make your first appointment.
