Dementia Action Week (15 – 21 May 2023)

Warwickshire County Council is proud to support Dementia Action Week, taking place between 15 - 21 May 2023. Dementia Action Week is an opportunity to raise awareness of dementia and the support available for people living with dementia and their carers.

In Warwickshire, over 8,000 people are living with dementia, although many more people are affected by dementia, including those who are caring for people living with dementia.

There are a range of support services available for those living with dementia and their carers. The key services are:

Dementia Connect in Warwickshire (funded by Warwickshire County Council, delivered by Alzheimer's Society)

Dementia Connect in Warwickshire can support anyone living with dementia or anyone caring for someone with dementia. They provide personalised advice and practical and emotional support, helping you and your loved ones at all stages of dementia. Anyone affected by dementia is encouraged to contact the service to ensure they are supported.

Warwickshire local welfare scheme

Help for residents at times of unavoidable crisis when they have no other means of support.

The discretionary scheme provides:

- Emergency support towards food, energy or other essentials
- Help to people whose needs are more long-term and who are vulnerable.

Charges for PPE from the Government PPE Portal

Currently the government PPE Portal provide free of charge PPE for most social care demand – including direct payment recipients and carers. Across the year 2023/2024 they are going to introduce charging for items. These charges came into effect from **17**th **April 2023** for some products. Those who have a government portal account should be informed via email and the aim is to give 6 weeks notices for any changes. Currently, most sizes of gloves (excluding XL) will be charged for from 17th April 2023. The information available on the Portal itself will be updated weekly (there is a PPE Portal Transition page with information on prices and FAQs for users) to reflect changes. It is advisable that organisations should start making alternative arrangements for accessing PPE.

In a notification received by the council it said "Although we endeavour to keep changeover dates from free to charged for as accurate as possible, there may be times when we have to extend or reduce these times, depending on how demand changes."
