# New Campaign Launched - 'There's no place like home' – support patients to recover well

The Trust is launching a campaign with Foundation Group partners', George Eliot Hospital NHS Trust, Worcester Acute Hospitals NHS Trust and Wye Valley NHS

Trust, which will focus on the importance of patients being discharged from hospital as soon as they are medically fit.

Research highlights that being in familiar surroundings aids recovery. Therefore, the campaign highlights how keeping a patient (particularly the elderly) in hospital for longer than necessary can cause serious harm. Recovering at home / a person's place of residence supports improved health and wellbeing outcomes.

## **UTI Prevention Information for Carers**

As a carer it's important to know the signs and symptoms of a urinary tract infection (UTI).

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) together with NHS England (NHSE), are running a joint campaign to raise awareness of UTI (urinary tract infection) prevention, symptom recognition and treatment including advice on how and when to seek help.

This campaign is targeted at:

- Older adults (65 years +) who are at higher risk of the impacts of urinary tract infections
- Paid and unpaid carers
