Young Carers Action Day (13 March 2024)

Warwickshire County Council and its partners support <u>Young Carers Action Day</u>, which is a national event to recognise the work carried out by young carers to support a family member or friend. Carers can be under immense strain, but over the past couple of years, the COVID pandemic has been a particularly trying time for those who have caring responsibilities. This year's theme is 'Fair Futures for Young Carers' hosted by Carers Trust. According to census 2021 data, there are 1,500 children in Warwickshire who care for someone who has a physical or mental illness/disability, or someone who needs support or struggles with substance misuse. However, many young carers remain hidden from support.

The impact of caring on young people is stark and more needs to be done to support and safeguard their future. <u>Caring Together Warwickshire</u> is the council's commissioned support for young carers and young adult carers and is provided by Carers Trust. The council in partnership with Carers Trust and other partners will be promoting Young Carers Action Day targeting a range of audiences. The council is committed to improving the support for young people who care for someone so that this minimises the impact on their future. Coming Soon! Empowering Futures: Growing Up Well in Warwickshire JSNA

Warwickshire County Council are currently working on an Empowering Futures: Growing Up Well in Warwickshire Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA) which looks at the physical health of children and young people aged 6 - 25. As part of this work, a section on vulnerable children and young people has been included, highlighting populations who are at increased risk of experiencing negative physical or mental health impacts.

Young Carers have been included as a population of focus in this JSNA to raise awareness of the health inequalities they can experience. The JSNA highlights the number of young carers in Warwickshire and what we know about the health of this population from evidence and research. This information will be used as an evidence base to help professional who work with young carers to think about the issues impacting them and ways they can be supported. The Empowering Futures JSNA is due to be published in May 2024.

Funding Opportunity

The <u>Tesco Stronger Starts</u> fund is open to all schools, registered charities and not-for-profit organisation to apply for a grant of up to £1,500. Priority is given to projects that provide food and support to young people. Every three months, 3 local good causes are selected to be in the blue token customer vote in Tesco stores throughout the UK.



Free Mentoring Available for Young People in Stratford

Lifespace currently have capacity for new referrals into their Community Mentoring Service. You can now refer yourself for mentoring if you are aged 16 – 19. If you are a parent / carer of a young person aged 12 – 15, you can request mentoring with your child. Community Mentoring takes place at the Stratford Youth Collective base.

Carer Friendly Employer Program

It is estimated there are 100,000 unpaid carers living in Warwickshire.

More than one in seven people in any workplace are carers. On average 600 people a day leave work to care because of these pressures. If unsupported, many working carers also face being tired, stressed, and struggling to manage their own health as well.

Without the right support, 1 in 6 carers give up work or reduce their working hours to care, but many will be your most skilled and experienced staff.

The Carer Friendly Employer Award is designed to support employers towards building a positive and inclusive workplace for all staff who are or will become carers.
