

Introduction

If you have named a Warwickshire grammar school on your child's secondary school application, this information will explain how your application has been considered. The information below also confirms the 2020 entry score data which has been established for each grammar school, along with the over-subscription criteria for each of these schools, to allocate places.

This information should be considered alongside your secondary school offer letter or email - which will be sent to you separately by your home authority – as well as your 11+ results letter, which you should have received previously.

Warwickshire 11+ test results

Each of Warwickshire's six grammar schools are their own admission authority and have set their own qualifying scores for 2020 entry. Each school also has its own over-subscription criteria, which has been considered where there have been more applicants than places available.

You should refer to the information below in conjunction with the notification provided by your home authority of the secondary school your child has been offered, as well as the 11+ test result for your child, provided by Warwickshire County Council.

How offers have been made at Warwickshire's Grammar Schools

The following information outlines the automatic qualifying scores which have now been established for each of the six Warwickshire grammar schools, as well as the criteria used when making offers for 2020 entry. Also included are details of the minimum score required in order to be placed on the waiting list for each of the grammar schools. These scores have been determined by a Committee of Reference as part of Warwickshire's Local Review Process.

Please note that only those applications for places at the Warwickshire grammar schools which are classed as on time will have been considered at this stage. Late applications for grammar school places will be considered **after** Monday 2nd March 2020.

Your child <u>will not</u> have been made a grammar school offer (even if they fall into one of the categories outlined below, where offers have been made) if they have been made an offer for a school listed as a higher preference on your secondary school application. In some cases, not all children within each category will have been offered a place. Priority is given first to those with the highest scores from the 11+ test. Where there is more than one applicant on the same score, and not enough spaces available to offer to all in the category, priority is given based on the straight-line distance from the school to the child's home address, as stated on their application. Please see each school's individual admission arrangements using the website links above for further information about each school's admission arrangements for this year of entry.

Late applications

Applications have also **not** been considered in this first round of offers where **either**;

- your secondary school application was submitted late to your home authority (i.e. after the national deadline of 31st October 2019), or;
- where you registered late for the 11+ test (i.e. after the deadline of 28th June 2019), or;



 where you did not submit satisfactory documentation in support of the address which has been used on your application, by the relevant deadline of 31st December 2019.

If your child has not been considered in this first round of offers, for one or more of these reasons, and they achieved at least the 'minimum waiting list score' as outlined below, then they will automatically be added to the waiting list of any grammar school that you have named on your application. Late applications for grammar school places will be considered **after** Monday 16th March. From this date, any vacancies that have become available since Monday 2nd March will be filled from the waiting lists.

*Please note that individual scores for children receiving an offer for a grammar school under Pupil Premium, LAC or EHCP criteria are not published in this data due to Data Protection legislation. 'LAC' relates to children who are in the care of the Local Authority or who were previously looked after, as defined by the School Admissions Code (2014). Children with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) will only be allocated a place if they meet the academic requirements of the grammar school for which an application has been made.



Waiting Lists

It may be possible for you to make a late preference for a Warwickshire grammar school, if you have not done so already, so that your child can be added to the relevant waiting list/s. Please contact your home authority to discuss this further.

If any places do become available at any of the grammar schools then re-offers from the waiting lists will be made <u>from</u> the Monday 16th March 2020 (please note: re-offers from the waiting lists will not necessarily be made <u>on</u> this date), as part of one of three specific reallocation rounds. The second reallocation round will then commence from 8th April 2020 and the third reallocation round will commence from 20th April 2020. If there are any further re-offers to make after this time, then applicants will be considered as and when vacancies become available.

Waiting lists for the grammar schools will be held according to the admission arrangements and over-subscription criteria for each grammar school, and a child's position is subject to change.

Please note that waiting list positions for the grammar schools will not be available until the week commencing Monday 16th March 2020
